
**ATTACHMENT A
REQUIREMENTS AND INFORMATION
ON USING GOTOMEETING TO ATTEND HEARING**

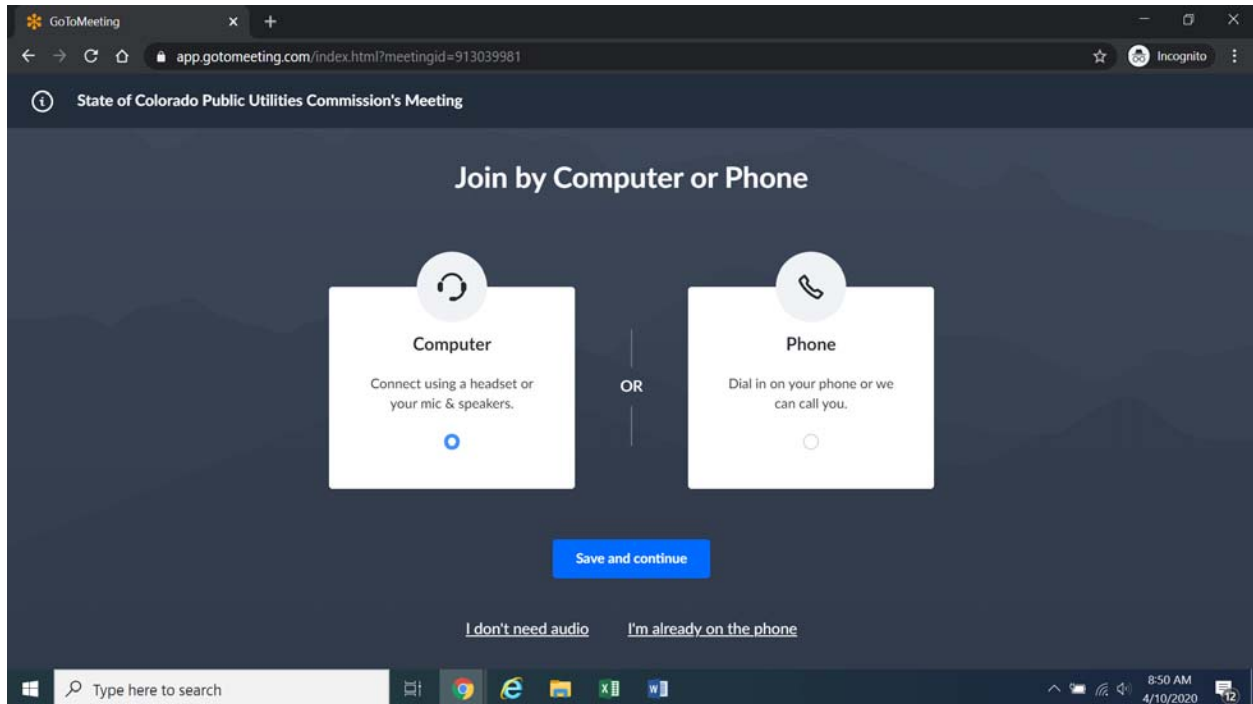
1. This Attachment directs participants on certain aspects of their participation in the scheduled remote public rulemaking hearing in this matter using GoToMeeting (<https://www.gotomeeting.com/>), and provides information which will aid participants in doing so. This is not intended to provide full and complete instructions on how to use GoToMeeting to participate in a hearing. Participants are responsible for ensuring they have familiarized themselves with GoToMeeting and are able to use it for the hearing (see <https://support.goto.com/meeting/system-check>).

2. Participants in a GoToMeeting hearing by video-conference must use a computer, smart phone, or tablet with internet access, an operational microphone, camera, and a speaker.¹ A few minutes prior to the start of the hearing, participants must enter the link in the underlying Decision or the GoToMeeting hearing in their internet browser.

¹ These instructions are not directed at using a tablet or smartphone to participate in a GoToMeeting video-conference. Participants who chose to use a smartphone or tablet are responsible for ensuring they are able to participate in the hearing.

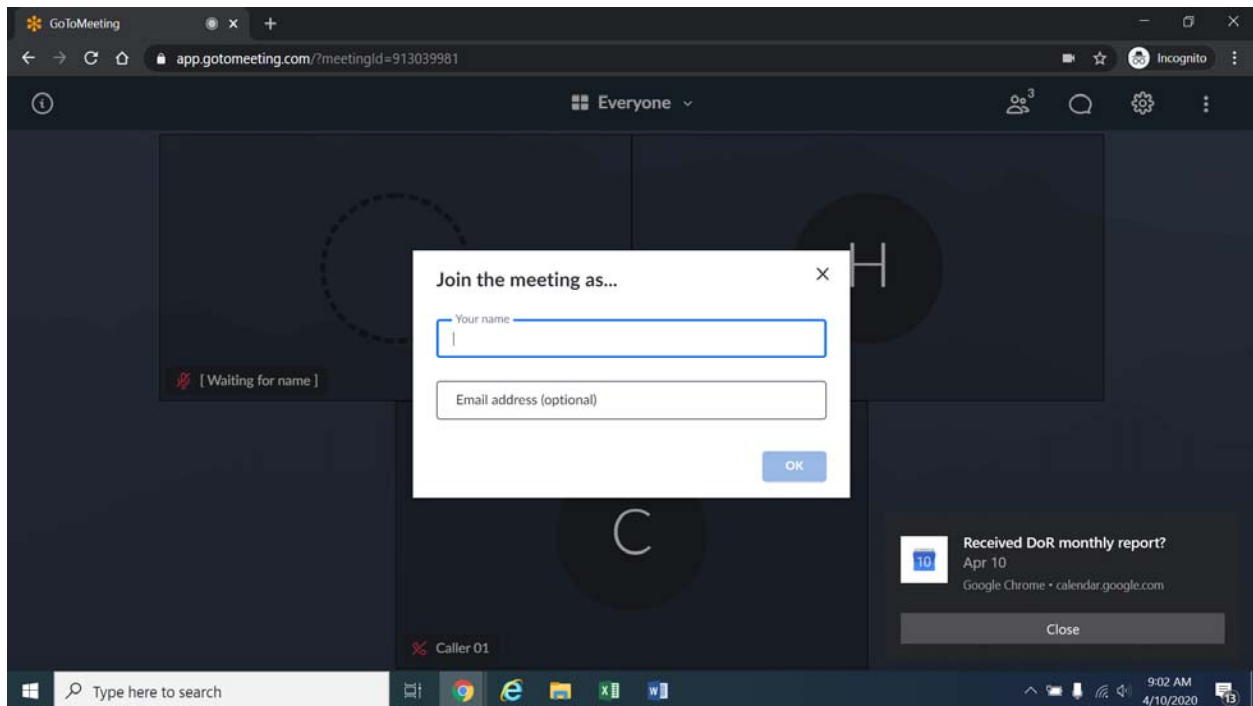
3. Participants will then be taken to the screen where they may join the hearing.

Participants should select the computer option, as shown in the below image.



4. Participants will then be required to confirm their audio settings; once complete, participants should select the “Save and continue” icon. If participants are prompted to allow the session to access their computers’ microphone and camera, they should allow access. As explained later, participants will be able to modify their settings during the session should they need to mute their microphone or turn off their cameras.

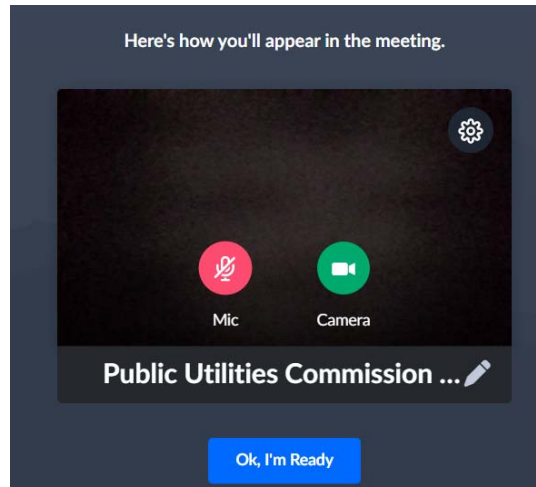
5. Participants will be prompted to enter their name for identification during the session, as shown in the image below.



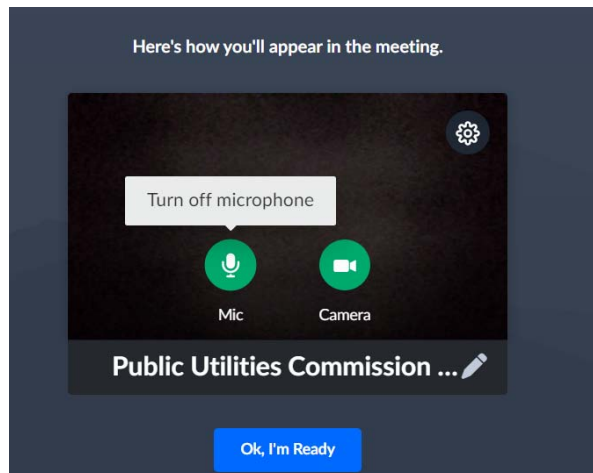
6. All participants must enter their full name. Among other reasons, this is required because the ALJ may call on participants to provide comments so that the hearing can proceed in an orderly fashion.

7. Participants may control the audio volume using their computer's audio controls. Those who do not want their picture displayed for others in the meeting may select the camera icon in the green circle at the bottom of the video screen at any point. A slash will appear over the camera icon, indicating that the camera has been turned off. Likewise, to mute or turn off the microphone, select the microphone icon and visually confirm that there is a slash over the

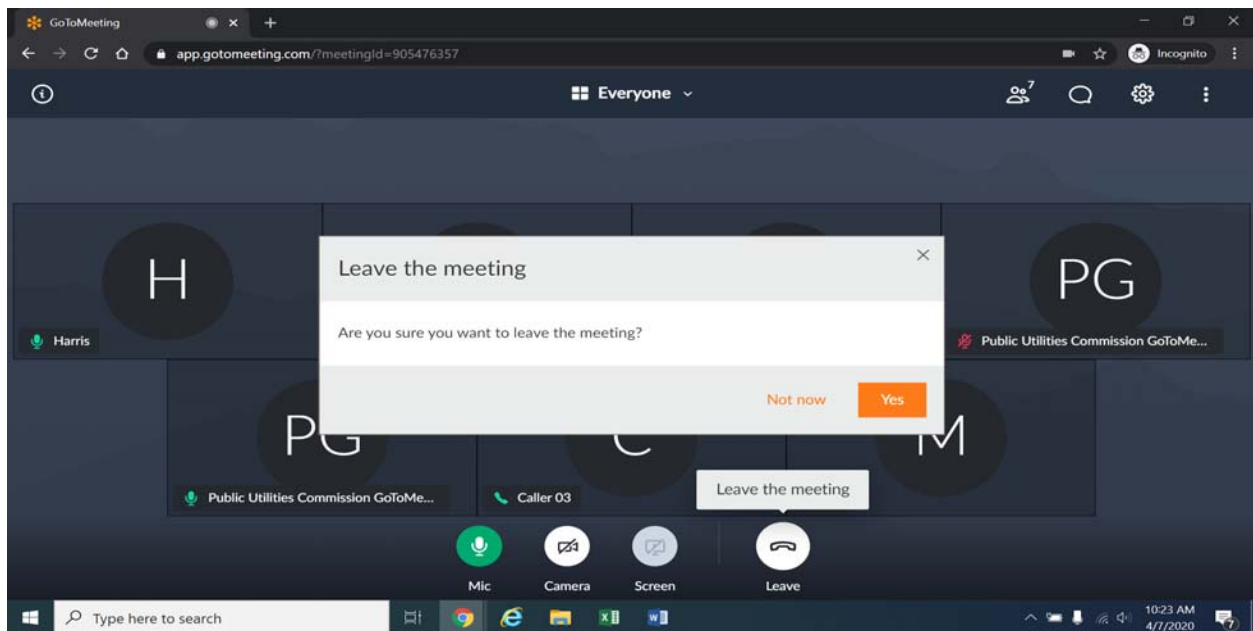
microphone icon. Illustratively, the below image shows the microphone turned off and the camera turned on.



8. Conversely, the below image shows the microphone and camera icons turned on and ready to transmit video and audio upon joining the hearing.



9. To terminate participation in the hearing, select the telephone handset icon with the word “Leave” underneath it and then select “Yes” in the pop-up box, as shown below. A party who inadvertently selects the handset icon may select “Not now” instead of “Yes” to stay in the meeting, as shown below.
