## STATEMENT

## By the Commission:

This is an application to exercise franchise rights to erect, construct, maintain and operate substations, electric light and power plants, transmission lines and a distribution system for the distribution and sale of electricity within the corporate limits of the City of Central City, Gilpin County, Colorado.

No protest was filed against this application.

No other utility is now serving the territory involved with electric energy.

The investment of the applicant at Central City amounts to approxiately \$10,000. The Commission, however, shall not be bound by this sum intested in any subsequent hearing involving the valuation of the property of
the applicant.

The electric energy distributed in Central City comes from the substation at Idaho Springs. There is no testimony in the record warranting the erection or construction of any electric light and power plant.

The Commission, after a careful consideration, is of the opinion, and so finds, that the public convenience and necessity requires the applicant to exercise the franchise rights granted by the City of Central City to the

applicant herein, designated as Ordinance No. 1-A, except as it applies to the construction of electric light and power plants.

## ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED, That the public convenience and necessity requires the exercise of franchise rights by the applicant granted to it by the City of Central City in Ordinance No. 1-A, except as to construction of electric light and power plants, and this order shall be deemed and held to be a certificate of public convenience and necessity therefor.
