STATEMENT
BY THE COMMISSION:
On March 22, 1990, Springer Electric Cooperative, Inc. (Springer), and San Isabel Electric Association, Inc. (San Isabel), jointly filed Docket No. 90A-209E requesting authority for Springer to transfer to San Isabel Springer's certificate of public convenience and necessity to provide electric service in part of Las Animas, Colorado. Notice of the application was given by the Commission to all interested persons, firms, and corporations on April 6, 1990. No protests or motions to intervene have been filed in connection with this application, and it is unopposed. Accordingly, pursuant to $\S 40-6-109(5)$, C.R.S., and Rule 24 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure, this application may be determined, based upon the verified application as filed.

## FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Springer and San Isabel are both electric utilities serving in Las Animas County, Colorado and subject to the jurisdiction of this Commission.
2. Springer is a New Mexico corporation authorized to do business in Colorado. Its principal office is located in Springer, New Mexico, and it does not have a principal office in Colorado. Springer was granted a certificate of public convenience and necessity by Decision Nos. 44499, dated August 18, 1955, 73488, dated September 8, 1969, and 73622, dated September 25, 1969, to serve the territory in Las Animas County which is more particularly described in Exhibit B attached to the application.
3. San Isabel is a Colorado corporation with its principal office in Pueblo West, Colorado. Its Colorado agent for service of process is William W. Wood, its general manager. A copy of its articles of incorporation and certificate of authority were attached to the application as Exhibit $A$. San Isabel's operations are to provide electric services within its certificated areas which generally surround the certificated territory of Springer. San Isabel's territory is set forth in Exhibit $D$ to the application which is a copy of Decision No 88068, dated January 14, 1976, in Application No. 28579. Appendix B to Decision No. 88068, dated January 14, 1976, sets forth the total area certificated to San Isabel pursuant to Decision No. 49302, dated January 13. 1958, Decision No. 474182, dated January 15, 1970, Decision No. 76421, dated December 9, 1970, Decision No. 79878, dated March 30, 1972, as well as Decision No. 88068, dated January 14, 1976.
4. San Isabel is affiliated with, and a member of colorado-Ute Electric Association, Inc., its wholesale supplier. No other person holds duplicating authority in any respect to the authority sought to be transferred pursuant to the application.
5. There are no areas not previously served which are the subject matter of the application. Springer and San Isabel requests the balance sheet, income statements, and statement of retained earnings submitted with the application be accepted by the Commission in lieu of an independent feasibility study, as set forth in Exhibit $E$, attached to the application.
6. A copy of San Isabel's tariffs containing the proposed rates, rules, and regulations to be applicable if the application is granted was attached to the application as Exhibit F.
7. No other public utility of like character provides similar service in or near the area involved in this application other than the City of Trinidad which is a municipally owned utility, which operates wholly within its municipal limits.
8. The territory sought to be transferred is all of the terrorities served by Springer in the State of colorado. If the application is granted springer would no longer conduct public utility operations in the State of Colorado as an adjunct to its public utility business in the State of New Mexico.
9. San Isabel's certificated territory surrounds Springer's territory sought to be transferred by this application. San Isabel has existing facilities in close proximity, including two transmission lines which provide an effective loop for service. San Isabel currently maintains a service center located closer to the relevant territory than that of Springer. San Isabel has the capacity to provide three-phase service for industrial and large customers. San Isabel's rates are currently lower than Springer's and the affected customers will receive equivalent service at lower cost.
10. A statement showing the accounting entries of San Isabel, including any plant acquisition adjustment, gain, or loss, for its books both before and after the proposed transfer is shown on Exhibits E and $H$, attached to the application. A like statement of accounting entries for Springer is shown on Exhibit J, also attached to the application.
11. A copy of the sales agreement between the parties, conditioned upon this Commission's approval, was attached to the application as Exhibit I.
12. A comparison of the kinds and costs of service rendered before and after the proposed transfer of Springer's certificate to San Isabel was attached to the application, Springer's rate schedule being Exhibit $K$ and San Isabel's rate schedule being Exhibit $F$.
13. If the transfer is granted, San Isabel will file any further necessary tariffs with the Commission and will operate in accordance with all of the applicable Commission Rules and Regulations.
14. This application resolves certain disputes between Springer and San Isabel and for the reasons already set forth in the above findings of fact, it is in the public interest and should be approved.

THEREFORE THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

1. Springer Electric Cooperative, Inc., is authorized to transfer its certificate of public convenience and necessity, granted by Decision Nos. 44499, dated August 25, 1955, 73488 dated September 8, 1969, and 76332 dated September 25, 1969, in Application No. 13522, to San Isabel Electric Association, Inc.
2. The total area certificated to San Isabel Electric Association, Inc., pursuant to this Commission Decision No. 49302, dated January 13, 1958; Decision No. 74182, dated January 15, 1970; Decision No. 76421, dated December 9, 1970; Decision No. 79878, dated March 30, 1972; Decision No. 88068, dated January 14, 1976, in this Decision is described by the description to set forth in Appendix B attached to this Decision.
3. San Isabel Electric Association shall operate in the territory described in the proceeding ordering paragraph pursuant to its rates, rules and regulations attached to the application as Exhibit $F$, until such time as they are lawfully changed.
4. San Isabel Electric Association shall affect accounting entries, including plant acquisition adjustment, gain, or loss, for its books in accordance with Exhibits $E$ and $H$, attached to the application.

This Decision is effective immediately. done in open meeting May 9, 1990.
