I. <u>BY THE COMMISSION</u>

A. Statement, Findings, and Conclusions

1. On July 10, 2014, Craig Taxi LLC, doing business as Craig Limousine Service (Craig Taxi) filed an application seeking authority to suspend operations under Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity (CPCN) PUC No. 55818 from July 7, 2014 through December 31, 2014.

2. The Commission noticed this application to all interested persons, firms, and corporations pursuant to § 40-6-108(2), C.R.S., on July 14, 2014.

3. No petition to intervene or otherwise participate in this proceeding has been filed. This proceeding is uncontested. Under § 40-6-109(5), C.R.S., this matter may be determined without a hearing.

4. The information submitted with this application complies with Rule 6204 of the Rules Regulating Transportation by Motor Vehicle, 4 *Code of Colorado Regulations* 723-6 and warrants the granting of the requested suspension of CPCN PUC No. 55818.

5. The Commission finds that the application submitted by Craig Taxi for authority to suspend CPCN PUC No. 55818 is in the public interest.

II. ORDER

A. The Commission Orders That:

1. This application was deemed complete on July 30, 2014, within the meaning of § 40-6-109.5, C.R.S.

2. The application filed by Craig Taxi, LLC, doing business as Craig Limousine Service for authority to suspend operations under Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity PUC No. 55818 is granted in part from the mailed date of this Decision through December 31, 2014.

3. On January 1, 2015, Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity PUC No. 55818 shall be administratively reactivated.

4. Prior to commencing operations, Craig Taxi, LLC, doing business as Craig Limousine Service shall: (a) cause proof of insurance or surety bond coverage to be filed with the Commission pursuant to Rule 6007, 4 *Code of Colorado Regulations* 723-6; (b) pay to the Commission the applicable vehicle identification fee for each vehicle to be operated under authority granted by the Commission; and (c) ensure that an effective tariff is on file with the Commission, in compliance with applicable Commission rules.

5. The 20-day time period provided by § 40-6-114(1), C.R.S., to file an application for rehearing, reargument, or reconsideration shall begin on the first day after the Commission mails or serves this Decision.

6. This Decision is effective on its Mailed Date.
