STIPULATED MOTION FOR AN ORDER

Complainants, Aspire Tours, LLC and ULLR Tours LLC, d/b/a The Colorado Sightseer ("Complainants") by and through their counsel, Charles Kimball of Kimball & Nespor PC, and iLimo Limousine and Tour Company ("Respondent"), by and through its counsel, Igor Raykin of Kishinevsky & Raykin, LLC, hereby submit this **Stipulated Motion For an Order**. In support thereof, the parties show the Colorado Public Utilities Commission's (PUC or Commission) as follows:

- On May 31, 2018, Complainants filed a formal complaint ("Complaint") against
 Respondent, alleging that Respondent was advertising and providing intrastate
 transportation services without authority from the Commission. That filing commenced
 this Proceeding.
- 2. A hearing is set for this matter on September 20, 2018.

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3. The parties stipulate to the entry of an order settling this case with the following

language:

a. Respondent will not use its current authority to advertise per person pricing or

provide service with per person charges.

b. Respondent will not provide sightseeing services.

4. Nothing in these restrictions is meant to apply to any future PUC authority that

Respondent obtains or may obtain.

5. Respondent will have seven days from the adoption of this order by this Honorable Court

to adhere to the restrictions.

6. Complainants and Respondent advise the PUC that they believe that stipulation for an

order is restrictive in nature, unambiguous, and capable of enforcement. The parties

request that the proposed order be entered. Complainants further advise the PUC that if

this Stipulation is approved by the PUC and the proposed order is entered, their interest in

the Complaint will be satisfied and their Complaint can be deemed satisfie.

7. In the event the proposed restrictions in this Stipulation are rejected, or accepted in a

form other than as submitted above, Complainants' interests in the Complaint will not

have been satisfied, and Complaint will continue.

Request for Waiver of Response Time

1. Since this is a Stipulated Motion between the parties, the parties request that the response

time to the within Stipulated Motion be waived.

WHEREFORE, Complainants and Respondent request that the Commission grant their

Stipulated Motion as requested and that the response time to the Stipulated Motion be waived.
