I. <u>BY THE COMMISSION</u>

A. Statement, Findings, and Conclusions

- 1. On April 17, 2020, Nash Pillsbury, doing business as Ride Taxi filed an application seeking authority to suspend operations under its authority, Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity (CPCN) PUC No. 55868 from April 18, 2020 through April 30, 2020.
- 2. The Commission noticed this application to all interested persons, firms, and corporations pursuant to § 40-6-108(2), C.R.S., on April 20, 2020, for a period of ten days.
- 3. The notice period expired on April 30, 2020. No petition to intervene or otherwise participate in this proceeding has been filed. This proceeding is therefore uncontested and under § 40-6-109(5), C.R.S., may be determined without a hearing.

- 4. In accordance with Rule 6205 of the Rules Regulating Transportation by Motor Vehicle, 4 Code of Colorado Regulations 723-6, the information submitted with this application warrants the granting of a suspension of operations.
- 5. The application for authority to suspend CPCN PUC No. 55868 is in the public interest and will be granted.

II. **ORDER**

The Commission Orders That: A.

- 1. This application was deemed complete on May 6, 2020, within the meaning of § 40-6-109.5, C.R.S.
- 2. The application filed by Nash Pillsbury, doing business as Ride Taxi for authority to suspend operations under Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity (CPCN) PUC No. 55868 is granted, nunc pro tunc, from April 18, 2020 through April 30, 2020.
 - 3. On May 1, 2020, CPCN PUC No. 55868 shall be administratively reactivated.
- 4. Prior to commencing operations, Nash Pillsbury, doing business as Ride Taxi shall: (a) cause proof of insurance or surety bond coverage to be filed with the Commission pursuant to Rule 6008, 4 Code of Colorado Regulations 723-6; (b) pay to the Commission the applicable vehicle identification fee for each vehicle to be operated under authority granted by the Commission; and, (c) ensure that an effective tariff is on file with the Commission, in compliance with applicable Commission rules.
- 5. The 20-day time period provided by § 40-6-114(1), C.R.S., to file an application for rehearing, reargument, or reconsideration shall begin on the first day after the Commission mails or serves this Decision.
