I. <u>BY THE COMMISSION</u>

A. Statement, Findings, and Conclusions

- 1. On November 16, 2020, DLT Transport, LLC filed an application requesting the Commission authorize the suspension of operations under Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity (CPCN) PUC No. 55954 from November 16, 2020 through March 1, 2021.
- 2. The Commission noticed this application to all interested persons, firms, and corporations pursuant to § 40-6-108(2), C.R.S., on November 23, 2020, for a period of ten days.
- 3. The notice period expired on December 3, 2020. No petition to intervene or otherwise participate in this proceeding has been filed. This proceeding is therefore uncontested and under § 40-6-109(5), C.R.S., may be determined without a hearing.
- 4. In accordance with Rule 6205 of the Rules Regulating Transportation by Motor Vehicle, 4 *Code of Colorado Regulations* (CCR) 723-6, the information submitted with this application warrants the granting a suspension of operations under CPCN PUC No. 55954.

5. The Commission finds that the application for authority to suspend CPCN PUC No. 55954 is in the public interest and will be granted from November 16, 2020 through March 1, 2021.

II. **ORDER**

A. **The Commission Orders That:**

- 1. This application was deemed complete on December 9, 2020, within the meaning of § 40-6-109.5, C.R.S.
- 2. The application filed by DLT Transport, LLC for authority to suspend operations under Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity (CPCN) PUC No. 55954 is granted, nunc pro tunc, from November 16, 2020 through March 1, 2021.
 - 3. On March 2, 2021, CPCN PUC No. 55954 shall be administratively reactivated.
- 4. Prior to commencing operations, DLT Transport, LLC shall: (a) cause proof of insurance or surety bond coverage to be filed with the Commission pursuant to Rule 6008, 4 Code of Colorado Regulations 723-6; (b) pay to the Commission the applicable vehicle identification fee for each vehicle to be operated under authority granted by the Commission; and, (c) ensure that an effective tariff is on file with the Commission, in compliance with applicable Commission rules.
- 5. The 20-day time period provided by § 40-6-114(1), C.R.S., to file an application for rehearing, reargument, or reconsideration shall begin on the first day after the Commission mails or serves this Decision.
 - 6. This Decision is effective on its Mailed Date.
