# I. <u>STATEMENT</u>

### A. Background

- 1. La Plata Electric Association, Inc. and United Power, Inc. (United Power) (collectively, Complainants) filed these formal complaints against Tri-State Generation and Transmission Association, Inc. on November 5 and 6, 2019, respectively, requesting that this Commission determine a just, reasonable, and non-discriminatory exit charge for Complainants. On November 25, 2019, by Decision No. C19-0955-I, the Commission consolidated the complaints in Proceeding Nos. 19F-0620E and 19F-0621E and designated Commissioner Frances Koncilja as the Hearing Commissioner.
- 2. The procedural history of this proceeding is set out in previous Decisions and is repeated here as necessary to put this Decision in context.
- 3. Commissioner Koncilja's term expired in January 2020. She was asked and agreed to continue to serve until a new commissioner was appointed and confirmed in her stead. A new Commissioner was sworn in on March 13, 2020.

- 4. On March 13, 2020, by Decision No. R20-0175-I, the evidentiary hearing in this proceeding, scheduled for March 23 to March 27, 2020, was suspended and the proceeding returned to the Commission *en banc*.
- 5. On March 23, 2020, United Power filed its Notice of After-Decided Authority and Request for Video or Telephonic Status Conference.
- 6. On March 25, 2020, by Decision No. C20-0201-I, the Commission referred the matter to an Administrative Law Judge.
- 7. On April 3, 2020, by Decision No. R20-0218-I, a status conference was scheduled for April 14, 2020.
- 8. At the status conference, dates for an evidentiary hearing and post hearing statements of position were agreed to by the parties.

#### **B.** Impact of Subsequent Developments on Hearings

9. On March 10, 2020, Colorado Governor Jared Polis declared a state of emergency over the novel coronavirus pandemic (COVID-19). Since then, Colorado State government and the Commission have been working diligently to address how to safely and effectively manage the challenges presented by COVID-19. These efforts have focused on limiting the disruption to the services delivered by the Commission (and other State agencies), while attempting to mitigate the risks to State employees and the public. For example, the Commission has been conducting its Weekly Meetings remotely, and the Commission has asked members of the public not to attend meetings in person, but to view them by webcast. More recently, public access to

the building containing the Commission's offices and hearing rooms has been restricted and it is unclear when the restriction will be lifted.

10. Under these circumstances, the hearing scheduled for the week of May 18, 2020 shall be converted into a remote hearing in which the participants will appear from remote locations, as provided below. The ALJ finds that holding a remote hearing is consistent with current public health advisories to prevent the spread of COVID-19. The ALJ concludes that it is in the parties' and the public interest to hold the hearing in this proceeding as a remote hearing.

## C. Instructions for Participating in Remote Hearing

- 11. The Commission uses the web-hosted video conferencing service, GoToMeeting, to hold video conferences, and in this case, a remote hearing. Parties and witnesses may participate in the remote hearing by computer, or telephone. Attending the hearing by computer allows for video-conference participation in the hearing. Participating by video-conference allows parties wishing to present evidence to display exhibits on the video-conference screen and allows others participating by video-conference to view the displayed exhibits as they are presented in a manner most similar to that which occurs during in-person hearings.
- 12. The ALJ strongly encourages all parties and witnesses to participate in the hearing using a computer, especially any party wishing to present documents for consideration during the hearing. Parties joining the hearing by telephone may view exhibits by accessing the exhibits within the administrative record for this proceeding through the Commission's free E-Filing

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> The ALJ has engaged in informal communication with the parties via email concerning holding the hearing as scheduled but converting it into a remote hearing or continuing the hearing. During those informal communications, the ALJ instructed the parties that an interim decision converting the hearing to a remote hearing would issue on April 27, 2020 unless the parties filed a motion requesting to continue the hearing. As no such motion has been filed by one or all of the parties, the ALJ is issuing this Decision at this time.

## 1. Instructions for Participating by Telephone


14. The parties will be provided a telephone number via email by the ALJ during the week prior to the hearing. Those who intend on participating by telephone during the remote hearing must call the phone number when the hearing takes place. When prompted, input the Meeting ID/Access Code which will also be provided, to join the hearing. The parties are on notice that they are not to share this information with the public, the media, or anyone who will not be participating in the hearing. Instructions for non-participants to listen to the hearing are contained in paragraph 21.

# 2. Instructions for Participating by Computer

15. Any party who wishes to participate in the remote hearing by computer must use a computer that is connected to the internet and has a microphone and a speaker. At the time of the

hearing, please go to a link that will be provided to the parties during the week before the hearing. The parties are on notice that they are not to share this link with the public, the media, or anyone who will not be participating in the hearing. Instructions for non-participants to listen to the hearing are contained in paragraph 21.









Conversely, the screenshot of the webpage below shows the microphone and video icons turned on and are ready to transmit video and audio when you join the hearing:




18. You can control the volume of the audio through the volume controls on your computer. The screenshot below shows the screen after joining the hearing with the camera turned on and the microphone turned off:




- 19. All participants in the hearing should mute (turn off) their microphones during the hearing until called upon by the ALJ. When prompted by the ALJ, please click on the microphone icon to turn on your microphone and then commence speaking. The red circle around the microphone icon will turn green indicating that your microphone is turned on. While you are speaking, please listen for any direction you are given by the ALJ.<sup>2</sup>
- 20. To terminate your participation in the hearing, please click on the telephone handset icon with the word "Leave" underneath it and then click the "Yes" button in the pop-up


