I. <u>BY THE COMMISSION</u>

A. Statement

1. This matter comes before the Commission for consideration of an application (Application) filed by the Colorado Department of Transportation (CDOT) on behalf of the County of Baca (Baca County) on November 9, 2022, requesting authority to install active warning equipment consisting of flashing lights, bells, a new signal cabin, and constant warning time circuitry, using Federal Section 130 Funds, at the crossing of Baca County Road J (BCR J) with the tracks of the BNSF Railway (BNSF) at railroad mile post 152.216 of the Boise City Subdivision, National Inventory No. 003732X, near the Town of Campo, Baca County, State of Colorado.

2. The Commission gave notice of this Application (Notice) to all interested parties, including adjacent property owners pursuant to § 40-6-108(2), C.R.S. The Notice was mailed on November 14, 2022.

3. On December 9, 2022, BNSF filed a Notice of Intervention. BNSF does not contest or oppose the application.

4. The Commission has reviewed the record in this matter and deems that the Application is complete within the meaning of § 40-6-109.5, C.R.S.

5. The Commission has jurisdiction in this matter under §§ 40-4-106(2)(a) and (3)(a), C.R.S.

6. Now being fully advised in the matter, we grant the Application.

A. Findings of Fact

7. The Commission gave notice to all interested parties, including the adjacent property owners. No intervention was received opposing the Application.

8. CDOT requests authority to install active warning equipment consisting of flashing lights, gates, bells, new signal cabin, and constant warning time circuitry at the crossing of BCR J with the BNSF.

9. There was one property damage only and one injury accident at the crossing that occurred in 2019 and 2022, respectively.

10. CDOT states the current traffic volume using the crossing is approximately 100 vehicles per day (VPD) at an unposted speed limit of 55 miles per hour (MPH) with approximately 35 percent heavy vehicles using the crossing. School buses do use the crossing. Traffic is projected to grow to approximately 116 VPD by 2026 and 150 VPD by 2041. There

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are currently approximately 10 thru train movements per day using the crossing at speeds of up to 49 MPH with no current projections of future train traffic growth.

11. The estimated cost for the work at the crossing is \$234,284 for the signal work and \$25,000 for the civil engineering elements of construction with Federal Section 130 Funds paying for the cost of the project.

12. CDOT estimates that construction will begin on March 6, 2023 and be completed by June 24, 2024. CDOT will be required to file a copy of the signed Construction and Maintenance Agreement for this crossing prior to starting work at the crossing. We will expect this signed agreement to be filed no later than March 4, 2023 prior to the start of construction. We will also require CDOT to inform the Commission in writing that the crossing work is complete and operational within ten days of completion. The Commission will expect this letter by June 24, 2022. However, the Commission does understand this letter may be provided earlier or later than this date depending on changes or delays to the construction schedule.

13. We will require CDOT and BNSF to update their respective parts of the crossing inventory form for this crossing and file a copy of the updated crossing inventory form in this proceeding. The Commission will expect this information to be filed with the completion of the crossing work by June 24, 2024.

B. Conclusions

14. The Commission has jurisdiction in this matter under §§ 40-4-106(2)(a) and (3)(a), C.R.S.

15. No intervenor that filed a petition to intervene or other pleading contests or opposes the Application.

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16. Because the Application is unopposed, the Commission will determine this matter, upon the record, without a formal hearing under § 40-6-109(5), C.R.S., and Rule 1403, Commission Rules of Practice and Procedure, 4 *Code of Colorado Regulations* 723-1.

17. Based on the Findings of Fact, we find good cause exists and that the requirements of public safety are met by granting the Application consistent with the above discussion.

II. ORDER

A. The Commission Orders That:

1. The application (Application) filed by the Colorado Department of Transportation (CDOT) on behalf of the County of Baca (Baca County) on November 9, 2022, requesting authority to install active warning equipment consisting of flashing lights, bells, a new signal cabin, and constant warning time circuitry, using Federal Section 130 Funds, at the crossing of Baca County Road J (BCR J) with the tracks of the BNSF Railway (BNSF) at railroad mile post 152.216 of the Boise City Subdivision, National Inventory No. 003732X, near the Town of Campo, Baca County, State of Colorado is deemed complete within the meaning of § 40-6-109.5, C.R.S.

- 2. The intervention of BNSF is granted.
- 3. The Application is granted.

4. CDOT is authorized and ordered to proceed with installation of active warning equipment consisting of flashing lights, gates, bells, new signal cabin, and constant warning time circuitry at the crossing at BCR J in Baca County.

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5. CDOT shall file a copy of the signed Construction and Maintenance Agreement for this project by March 6, 2023 prior to starting work at the crossing.

6. CDOT shall inform the Commission in writing that the crossing changes are complete and operational within ten days of completion. We shall expect this letter by June 24, 2024. However, we understand this letter may be provided earlier or later than this date depending on changes or delays to the construction schedule.

7. CDOT and BNSF shall be required to update the National Inventory Form for this crossing and file a copy of the updated crossing inventory form in this proceeding by June 24, 2022.

8. The 20-day period provided for in § 40-6-114, C.R.S., within which to file applications for rehearing, reargument, or reconsideration, begins on the first day following the effective date of this Decision.

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- 9. This Decision is effective on its Mailed Date.
