INTERIM DECISION OF HEARING COMMISSIONER MEGAN GILMAN SCHEDULING PUBLIC COMMENT HEARING

Adopted Date: November 8, 2022

I. STATEMENT

A. Background

1. By this Decision, I schedule a public comment hearing on the Verified Application for Approval of its Distribution System Plan (DSP) (Application) that, Public Service Company of Colorado (Public Service or Company) filed on May 2, 2022.

B. Discussion

- 2. The Application was deemed complete on June 17, 2022, by operation of the Commission's rules under § 40-6-109.5, C.R.S.
- 3. On June 15, 2022, the Commission issued Decision No. C22-0379-I referred the Application for hearing before Commissioner Megan Gilman. The decision also established the parties to this matter and set forth certain questions that it requests Public Service to address in the form of supplemental direct testimony in this Proceeding.

- 4. On July 19, 2022, Public Service filed a notice of a Suggested Unopposed Procedural Schedule and Discovery Procedures. The Hearing Commissioner adopts the Parties' discovery procedure proposal. The Commission's discovery rules and procedures will apply to discovery in this proceeding with the modification that responses to discovery on rebuttal and cross-answer testimonies will be due within 5 business days.
- 5. In Decision No. R22-0474-I, issued August 10, 2022, adopted a proposed procedural schedule.
- 6. I note that Senate Bill 21-272 (SB-272) recognized that certain Colorado communities have historically been forced to bear a disproportionate burden of adverse human health and environmental effects. SB 21-272 also identifies "lack of public participation" as a factor that impacts the health and environment of a community. The Commission has not yet initiated a rulemaking to implement Senate Bill 21-272, however, the Company considers disproportionately impacted communities in its selection of Non-Wires Alternatives.
- 7. Given the importance of this Proceeding on retail customer programs, and in anticipation of the evidentiary hearing beginning on December 5, 2022, I find it appropriate to schedule a remote public comment hearing at two different times². The public comment hearing will take place on December 1, 2022. The remote public comment hearing will run from 12:00 p.m. to 1:00 p.m., and from 4:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. or until concluded.
- 8. Additional information about participation in the public comment hearing, such as sign-up sheets, and all relevant information on how to log on to the remote public comment

hearing will be made available on the Commission's public calendar at https://puc.colorado.gov/puccalendar closer to the hearing dates.

- 9. The public comment hearings will be transcribed live by a court reporter to create a written record of the comments received. Commenters should give their full name, and spell it, before they give their comments. In general, commenters will be called to speak in the order in which they sign up. The presiding officer may adopt procedures and time limits for comments as necessary to ensure that all members of the public have opportunity to comment, and the transcribed record is clear and understandable. Typical time limits range from one to three minutes for each commenter. To ensure the hearing time is used efficiently, commenters are requested to avoid repetitive comments that re-state filed written comments or repeat oral comments already provided at hearing. As discussed below, written public comment can be filed at any time in the proceeding and will be afforded the same weight as oral comments. Finally, the purpose of a public comment hearing is to provide opportunity for members of the public to provide oral comments. To that end, parties to the Proceeding and their representatives are not permitted to present comments. Individuals may present comments on their own behalf.
- 10. The Commission will publicize the public comment hearing by press release, announcement on its public calendar, and make it known by other avenues to the extent resources are available.
- 11. The remote public comment hearing will be webcast on the Commission's website. This means that those persons wishing to observe but not participate in the public comment hearing may do so by watching the webcast. To observe a public comment hearing, enter this link in the web browser https://puc.colorado.gov/webcasts and select the audio or video option for Hearing Room A. The Commission encourages interested persons who do not wish to

provide comments at the remote public comment hearing to observe it through the webcast rather than Zoom. Doing so will help minimize background noise during the hearing and may assist in the orderly progression of the hearing.

- 12. We remind the public that participating in the public comment hearings is not the only way to provide comments in this Proceeding. We encourage interested persons to provide written or oral public comments at any time this Proceeding is open. Public comments can be provided by:
