I. <u>BY THE COMMISSION</u>

A. Statement, Findings, and Conclusions

1. This matter comes before the Commission for consideration of a filing submitted on November 7, 2023, by Harris & Co. Holdings, LLC, doing business as Harris & Co. Holdings LLC DBA GEST Carts - Denver (Applicant), requesting that the Commission grant a 60-day extension to comply with the terms of Decision No. C23-0600 (Decision).

2. On July 10, 2023, Applicant filed an application for New Permanent Authority to Operate as a Common Carrier of Passengers by Motor Vehicle for Hire.

3. The Commission noticed the application to all interested persons, firms, and corporations pursuant to § 40-6-108(2), C.R.S., on July 17, 2023. This proceeding was uncontested; and thus, it was determined without a hearing.

4. On September 12, 2023, the Commission issued the Decision and granted the application, subject to Applicant's full compliance with the requirements contained in Ordering Paragraph No. 3 of the Decision.

5. Ordering Paragraph No. 3 of the Decision requires Applicant to file proof of insurance; pay the motor vehicle fee and issuance fee; submit an advice letter with tariff and a vehicle inspection; and register with the Commission's electronic filing system.

6. The Decision gave Applicant 60 days from its effective date of September 12, 2023, to comply with each of these requirements. For good cause shown, the Commission may grant additional time for compliance, if the request for additional time is filed within 60 days of the effective date of the Decision.

7. On November 7, 2023, Applicant timely filed the instant request for a 60-day extension to comply with the Decision. Applicant states: "My family has been hit with a couple of deaths the past two months and it has been hard. In addition, we are waiting on the insurance company to file their documents via the eFile system and unfortunately, we do not have an estimated time this will be completed."

8. The Commission concludes that good cause exists to grant Applicant's request for a 60-day extension to comply with the Decision.

II. ORDER

A. The Commission Orders That:

1. The filing submitted by Harris & Co. Holdings, LLC, doing business as Harris & Co. Holdings LLC DBA GEST Carts - Denver, on November 7, 2023, requesting that the

Commission grant a 60-day extension to complete the requirements set forth in Decision No. C23-0600, is granted.

2. Harris & Co. Holdings, LLC, doing business as Harris & Co. Holdings LLC DBA GEST Carts - Denver, is granted 60 days from the Mailed Date of this Decision to comply with the requirements set forth in Decision No. C23-0600.

3. The 20-day time period provided by § 40-6-114(1), C.R.S., to file an application for rehearing, reargument, or reconsideration shall begin on the first day after the Commission mails or serves this Decision.

4. This Decision is effective on its Mailed Date.
