I. <u>STATEMENT</u>

A. Background

1. On November 9, 2022, the Colorado Public Utilities Commission initiated this proceeding by issuing a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking (NOPR) to amend the Rules Regulating Pipeline Operators and Gas Pipeline Safety. The NOPR proposed significant changes to the aforementioned rules, described those changes in detail and the justification therefor, attached the Rules in legislative (*i.e.*, strikeout/underline) format and in a clean version, established deadlines of December 12, 2022 and January 3, 2023 for initial comments and response comments concerning the proposed rules, respectively, and scheduled a remote hearing for January 19, 2023 at 9:00 a.m. for oral comments regarding the proposed rules. The NOPR also

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referred this proceeding to an Administrative Law Judge (ALJ). The proceeding was subsequently assigned to the undersigned ALJ.

- 2. The American Petroleum Institute (API), Atmos Energy Corporation (Atmos), Black Hills Colorado Gas, Inc., doing business as Black Hills Energy, Colorado Natural Gas, Inc., Colorado Oil and Gas Association, Public Service Company of Colorado (Public Service), the Southern Ute Indian Tribe and Red Cedar Gathering Company, and the Office of the Utility Consumer Advocate (UCA) filed initial comments. API, Atmos, Public Service, and the UCA filed response comments.
- 3. At 9:00 a.m. on January 23, 2023, the ALJ held the hearing noticed in the NOPR. The ALJ discussed the proposed rules and the initial and response comments with the participants at the hearing. Based on the input of the participants at the hearing, the ALJ ordered another round of comments by February 9, 2023 addressing: (a) the current status of the Order Addressing the Designation of Sensitive Security Information issued by the Transportation Security Administration on November 12, 2008 (TSA's SSI Order); (b) whether the TSA's SSI Order applies to the Colorado Oil and Gas Conservation Committee (COGCC) and specifically to Rule 1101.e of the COGCC's Flowline Regulations; and (c) whether the TSA's SSI Order applies to the Commission and specifically its Rules Regulating Pipeline Operators and Gas Pipeline Safety. The ALJ also continued the remote public comment hearing to May 2, 2023 at 9:00 a.m.
- 4. At 9:00 a.m. on May 2, 2023, the ALJ held the continued hearing noticed in the NOPR. The ALJ discussed the proposed rules and the written and oral comments with the participants at the hearing. Based on the input of the participants at the hearing, the ALJ ordered another round of comments due by June 16, 2023 and response comments due by June 23, 2023

addressing: (a) the comments submitted by Mark and Julie Nygren on May 1, 2023; (b) the definitions of "advanced leak detection technology" proposed by the Pipeline Safety Trust and possibly the Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration in its proposed rules; (c) if the Commission concludes that it must make publicly available a GIS mapping tool containing pipeline information at the 1:6,000 scale, what actions can be taken to mitigate or eliminate the risk that bad actors can use the provided information to undertake improper action; and (d) the other questions raised at the May 2, 2023 continued remote public comment hearing.

5. At 11:30 a.m. on June 29, 2023, the ALJ held the second continued hearing. The ALJ discussed the proposed rules and the written and oral comments with the participants at the hearing. Based on the input of the participants at the hearing, the ALJ ordered another round of comments due by July 13, 2023 and response comments due by July 27, 2023 focusing on rule amendments that CEO states it will propose in its July 13 comments, and any other issues raised in this proceeding.

B. Continued Remote Public Comment Hearing

6. During the second continued remote public comment hearing on June 29, 2023, the undersigned ALJ announced the continuation of the hearing. This Interim Decision memorializes the continuance of the proceeding to August 3, 2023 from 11:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. will continue until concluded, meaning, that the hearing will continue until all public comments are received, but will end no later than the designated end-time (3:30 p.m.). The hearing will not be held open for public comments after all those who have appeared have provided public comment and therefore may conclude before the scheduled end time (3:30 p.m.). For example, if all those who appear at the 11:30 a.m. remote public comment hearing have provided public comment by 1:00 p.m. or earlier, the remote public comment hearing will be adjourned. This

also means that anyone who chooses to join the public comment hearing session after the designated start time assumes the risk that the hearing will be concluded before they join. However, regardless of how early participants conclude their comments, the remote public comment hearing will continue at least into the lunch hour.

7. The public comment hearing will be held using the web-hosted video-conferencing service, Zoom. This means that members of the public who wish to participate in the public comment hearing should not appear in person at the Commission's offices but should instead appear remotely via Zoom.

C. Observing the Public Comment Hearing

8. Consistent with Commission practice, the public comment hearing will be webcast on the Commission's website. Persons wishing to observe, but not provide comments in the hearing may do so by observing the webcast of the hearing and need not access the hearing through Zoom. To observe the hearing by webcast, enter this link in the web browser https://puc.colorado.gov/webcasts and select the audio or video option for the assigned hearing room. The assigned hearing room will be identified on the Commission's public calendar for the date and time of the hearing, at the following link: https://puc.colorado.gov/puccalendar.

D. Participating in the Public Comment Hearing

- 9. Those interested in providing public comment during the remote hearing through the Zoom web conferencing platform must click on the link in the calendar of events on the Commission's website, available at https://puc.colorado.gov/puccalendar before or during the hearing.
- 10. Those planning to provide comment during the hearing are strongly encouraged to prepare in advance and familiarize themselves with how to use the Zoom meeting platform.

Attachment A to this Decision provides step-by-step technical instructions and requirements to participate by video-conference using a computer. This is intended to ensure that the remote hearing proceeds efficiently. Hence, it is important that video-conference participants carefully review and follow all requirements in this Decision and Attachment A.

- 11. For those who wish to provide oral comments during the hearing, video-conference participation is preferred and encouraged because it allows for the hearing to be held in a manner most similar to in-person hearings. Nevertheless, interested persons have the option to participate by telephone.
- 12. The Commission strives to accommodate all members of the public at its hearings by providing services for foreign language users and persons with disabilities upon receipt of a reasonable accommodation request. Registrants requesting an interpreter during the public Language comment hearing should complete the Access Form at https://puc.colorado.gov/how-to-participate at least one week prior to the event. E. Other Methods to Submit Public Comment

- 13. Interested persons wishing to provide public comment need not participate in the public comment hearing to do so. In addition to accepting comments during the public comment hearing, the Commission makes available other means by which interested persons may provide written or oral comments. The Commission prefers written comments over oral comments but gives written and oral comments the same weight.
- 14. Interested persons are encouraged to submit written comments through either: (a) the Commission's Electronic Filing System at https://www.dora.state.co.us/pls/efi/EFI.homepage

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in this Proceeding; or (b) the Commission's website at https://puc.colorado.gov/ by clicking on

the "FILE A COMMENT OR COMPLAINT" link. Anyone using the latter option should ensure

that their comments include this Proceeding number (Proceeding No. 22AL-0426G).

15. Oral comments will be accepted from any interested person who leaves a voice

mail message at (303) 869-3490 or from commenters offering public comment during the

scheduled public comment hearing. Those leaving voice mail public comments must include

their name, the spelling of their name, and this Proceeding number (Proceeding No.

22R-0496GPS) in their message. Voice mail messages will be transcribed and placed in the

record of this Proceeding.

16. The Commission will equally consider public comments, regardless of the format

in which they are submitted (verbal or in writing).

Participants who want an interpreter to participate in the remote public comment hearing must complete the Language Access Form at https://puc.colorado.gov/how-to-participate at least one week prior to the event. The deadline for written comments addressing the issues identified above are July 13 and 27, 2023.
