I. **BY THE COMMISSION**

> Statement, Findings, and Conclusions A.

1. This matter comes before the Commission for consideration of a Motion submitted

on August 1, 2025, by Rory Roth, the owner of Hop Cart L.L.C. ("Applicant"), requesting that the

Commission grant an extension of 25 days for the company to comply with the terms of Decision

No. C25-0397 ("Decision").

2. On March 27, 2025, Applicant filed an Application for Permanent Authority to

Operate as a Common Carrier of Passengers by Motor Vehicle For Hire.

3. The Commission noticed the Application to all interested persons, firms, and

corporations pursuant to § 40-6-108(2), C.R.S., on April 7, 2025. This proceeding was

uncontested; and thus, it was determined without a hearing.

- 4. On May 23, 2025, the Commission issued the Decision and granted the Application, subject to Applicant's full compliance with the requirements contained in Ordering Paragraph No. 3 of the Decision.
- 5. Ordering Paragraph No. 3 of the Decision requires Applicant to file proof of insurance; pay the motor vehicle fee and issuance fee; submit an Advice Letter with Tariff and vehicle inspections, and register in the Commission's electronic filing system.
- 6. The Decision gave Applicant 60 days from its effective date of May 23, 2025, to comply with the Order; otherwise, "the CPCN is denied without further action of the Commission." Therefore, Applicant had until July 22, 2025, to complete the terms of the Decision. Applicant did not comply with all the requirements before that deadline; thus, the proceeding was closed without the CPCN being issued.
- 7. In the motion submitted on August 1, 2025, Mr. Roth states, in part, the following: "The reason for this request is due to a lack of understanding [of] the submission process and us shopping for the best insurance rates."
- 8. The Commission concludes that good cause exists to reopen the proceeding and grant the request for a 25-day extension to comply with the Decision.

II. ORDER

A. The Commission Orders That:

- 1. The motion submitted by Hop Cart L.L.C. on August 1, 2025, requesting that the Commission grant an extension of 25 days for it to complete the requirements set forth in Decision No. C25-0397, is granted.
- 2. Hop Cart L.L.C. is granted an additional 25 days from the Issued Date of this Decision to comply with the requirements set forth in Decision No. C25-0397.

- 3. The 20-day time period provided by § 40-6-114(1), C.R.S., to file an Application for Rehearing, Reargument, or Reconsideration shall begin on the first day after the Commission mails or serves this Decision.
 - 4. This Decision is effective immediately upon its Issued Date.
