

Pedicure Foot Spa Procedures:

After each Client:

| Step 1 | Step 2 | Step 3 | Step 4 |
|--|--|--|-----------------------------------|
| Drain all water and remove all debris from the foot spa. | Sanitize the surfaces and walls of the foot spas with soap or detergent to remove all visible debris, and rinse with clean, clear water. | Disinfect by spraying the surface of the foot basin with either an EPA-registered disinfectant with demonstrated bactericidal, fungicidal, or virucidal activity used according to manufacturer's instructions, or bleach (10%) solution, or 70-90% isopropyl alcohol. | Wipe dry with a disposable towel. |

At the end of each day:

30 days of Cleaning and Disinfection Report Must be posted within 5 feet from Pedicure spa

| Step 1 | Step 2 | Step 3 |
|--|--|--|
| Remove the screen. All debris trapped behind the screen of each foot spa shall be removed, and the screen and the inlet shall be sanitized with soap or detergent and water. | Before replacing the screen, totally immerse the screen in an EPA-registered disinfectant with an appropriate disinfectant according to manufacturer's instructions, or 10% bleach solution. | Flush the spa system with soap and warm water for 5 minutes, then rinse and drain. |

Each week:

After following the outlined required procedures for the end of each day

90 days of Cleaning and Disinfection Report must be posted within 5 feet from Pedicure Spa

| Step 1 | Step 2 | Step 3 | Step 4 | Step 5 |
|--|---|---|---|--|
| Fill the foot spa tub with cold water and 1 teaspoon of 5.25% bleach for each one gallon of water. | Circulate the solution through the foot spa system for 5 to 10 minutes. | Let the solution sit overnight (at least 6 – 10 hours). | The following morning and before the first customer, drain and flush the system with water. | Blow out the jets for 3-5 seconds to remove any water remaining. |
