HUD enforces anti-discrimination in fair housing on the basis of race, color, national origin, religion, sex, familial status (including children under the age of 18 living with parents or legal custodians, pregnant women, and people securing the custody of children under the age of 18), and handicap (disability).

Colorado Civil Rights Division

Bilingual staff available

The Colorado Civil Rights Division administers and enforces Colorado's civil rights laws in employment, housing and public accommodations. The Colorado Revised Statutes prohibit discrimination in employment, housing and public accommodations based on race, sex, national origin, ancestry, disability, creed, religion (employment), sexual orientation, color, marital status (housing and public accommodations), and familial status (housing only). Discrimination in employment based on age (40 through 69) or marriage to a co-worker also is prohibited. The CCRD implements the civil rights statutes through administrative enforcement (compliance) and outreach (research and education). Training programs are available in all aspects of civil rights, sexual harassment, preventive and protected class based. Publications are available in Spanish and English regarding current civil rights laws.
