STATEMENT, FINDINGS, AND CONCLUSIONS

BY THE COMMISSION:

1. Proper notice of the filing of this application has been given under § 40-6-108(2), C.R.S. No petition to intervene or otherwise participate in the proceeding has been filed by any person within the time prescribed. This proceeding is noncontested. Under § 40-6-109(5), C.R.S., this matter may be determined without a hearing.

2. The evidence submitted warrants the grant of authority as requested.

3. The present or future public convenience and necessity requires or will require the transportation service as requested.

4. Applicant is fit, willing, and able to properly perform the extended service as requested.

THEREFORE THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

1. Applicant is authorized to extend operations under Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity PUC No. 48776 as follows:

Transportation of passengers and their baggage, on schedule,

between Stapleton International Airport, in Denver, Colorado, and points within a five-mile radius of the intersection of 5th and Main Streets in Pueblo, Colorado, via I-70, I-25, I-225 and/or Quebec Street serving all intermediate points and off-route points located within a 15-mile radius of the intersection of I-25 and U.S. Highway 24 in Colorado Springs, Colorado.

Restricted to providing service to or from only points named in the carrier's published schedule

2. The complete authority under Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity PUC No. 48776 as extended, shall be as set forth in the attached Appendix.

3. Applicant, as the holder of Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity PUC No. 48776, shall operate in accordance with the Order of the Commission except when prevented by an Act of God, the public enemy, or extreme conditions.

4. Applicant shall cause to be filed with the Commission certificates of insurance as required by Commission rules. Applicant shall file a proper tariff and pay the issuance fee and annual vehicle identification fee. Operations may not begin until these requirements have been met. If the Applicant does not comply with the requirements of this ordering paragraph within 60 days of the effective date of this Order then ordering paragraph 1 above, which grants authority to the Applicant, shall be void, and the authority granted shall then be void. On good cause shown, the Commission may grant additional time for compliance, if the request for additional time is filed within the 60 days.

5. This Order is effective on its date of mailing. ADOPTED IN OPEN MEETING September 30, 1992.

Transportation of

passengers and their baggage,

(A) In scheduled service between points within a five-mile radius of the intersection of 5th and Main in Pueblo, Colorado, and Colorado Springs, Colorado, via Interstate 25, serving all intermediate points.

(B) In call-and-demand limousine service:

- (1) between points in Teller, Pueblo, and Fremont Counties, State of Colorado;
- (2)between points in Teller, Pueblo, and Fremont Counties, on the one hand, and, on the other hand, points in El Paso County, State of Colorado; and
- (3) between points in El Paso County, State of Colorado.
- (C)In charter service between all points in El Paso, Teller, and Fremont Counties, State of Colorado.
- (D) In charter and call-and-demand limousine service between all points in the County of El Paso, on the one hand, and, Stapleton International Airport in Denver, Colorado, on the other hand.
- (E)On schedule, between Stapleton International Airport, in Denver, Colorado, and points within a five-mile radius of the intersection of 5th and Main Streets in Pueblo, Colorado, via I-70, I-25, I-225 and/or Quebec Street serving all intermediate points and off-route points located within a 15-mile radius of the intersection of I-25 and U.S. Highway 24 in Colorado Springs, Colorado.

This Certificate is restricted as follows:

(1) Parts (A), (B), (C), and (D) are restricted against providing

service in vehicles with a seating capacity of seven or fewer (excluding the driver) or 32 or greater (excluding the driver).

- (2) Parts (A), (B), and (C) are restricted against providing sightseeing service. Sightseeing service is defined as the transportation of passengers for the sole purpose of viewing or visiting places of natural, historic or scenic interest and the transportation originates and terminates at the same point.
- (3) Parts (A) and (E) are restricted to providing service to and from points named in the certificate holder's filed schedule.
- (4) Part (B) (3) is restricted as follows:
- (B) to service which originates or terminates at points named in the certificate holder's filed schedule.
- (5) Part (D) is restricted against the transportation of passengers and their baggage originating or terminating within a one-mile radius of the intersection of Lake Avenue and Lake Circle, Colorado Springs, Colorado.
