STATEMENT

BY THE HEARINGS COMMISSIONER:

On October 19, 1992, U S WEST Communications, Inc. ("USWC"), filed Advice Letter No. 2298, dated October 19, 1992. USWC stated that the purpose of the Advice Letter was to introduce private switch automatic line location identification in connection with E-911 services.

By Decision No. C92-1452 (mailed November 18, 1992), the commission suspended the effective date of the tariff under § 40-6-111(1), C.R.S., and set the matter for hearing February 25, 1993.

The City and County of Denver ("Denver") filed its entry of appearance and notice of intervention on November 30, 1992. The Business Regulatory Coalition - Colorado ("BRCC") filed its petition to intervene on December 2, 1992, which was granted by Decision No. R92-1595-I. The Staff of the Public Utilities

Commission ("Staff") filed its motion to intervene out of time on December 23, 1992, which motion was granted by Decision No. C93-51.

On December 22, 1992 and January 8, 1993, USWC filed motions for extension of time within which to file its testimony in this case. The motions were granted by Decision No. C92-1619 and No. C93-51, respectively. USWC filed a motion for further extension of time on January 25, 1993.

Before the hearings commissioner ruled on the last motion for extension of time, USWC and the Staff entered into a Stipulation concerning the tariff ("Stipulation"). The Stipulation was executed on February 2, 1993, and filed with the commission on February 3, 1993. Denver and BRCC authorized USWC to state that they have no objection to the proposed tariff as revised by the Stipulation. -

Now being duly advised in the matter, the hearings commissioner hereby finds that USWC's January 25, 1993 motion for extension of time is moot. The February 25, 1993 hearing will be vacated, and the docket will be closed. The hearings commissioner further finds that the tariff, as revised by the Stipulation, sets forth just and reasonable rates, and that the service proposed to be offered by USWC pursuant to those rates is in the public interest.

Pursuant to § 40-6-109(2), C.R.S., it is recommended that the Commission enter the following order.

ORDER

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

1. The Stipulation concerning Private Switch Automatic Location Identification entered into on February 2, 1993, by U S WEST Communications, Inc., and the Staff of the Public Utilities Commission is approved.

2. U S WEST Communications, Inc., is directed to file with the Commission, on not less than one day's notice, the Private Switch Automatic Location Identification tariff in the form attached to the Stipulation as Exhibit 1.

3. The hearing set for February 25, 1993, is vacated, and this Docket No. 92S-678T is closed.

4. This Recommended Decision shall be effective on the day it becomes the Decision of the Commission, if that is the case, and is entered on its Mailed Date.

5. As provided by § 40-6-109, C.R.S., copies of this Recommended Decision shall be served upon the parties, who may file exceptions to it. If no exceptions are filed within 20 days after

service or within any extended period of time authorized, or unless the Decision is stayed by the Commission upon its own motion, the Recommended Decision shall become the Decision of the Commission and subject to the provisions of § 40-6-114, C.R.S.

6. If exceptions to this Decision are filed, they shall not exceed 30 pages in length, unless the Commission for good cause shown permits this limit to be exceeded.
