**COMMISSION ORDER DENYING
TEMPORARY AUTHORITY**

I. BY THE COMMISSION:

A. Statement, Findings, and Conclusion

1. On June 27, 1995, Express Shuttle, Inc. filed an application (Docket No. 95A-307BP-TA) for temporary authority to conduct operations as a contract carrier by motor vehicle for hire for the transportation of passengers and their baggage, between the offices of Time Warner Company, Scansco Management Company, Inc., and Antarctic Support Associates, all located in Englewood, Colorado, on the one hand, and, on the other hand, (1) Denver International Airport; and (2) other corporate offices of said companies located in the Counties of Denver, Adams, Arapahoe, Jefferson, and Boulder, State of Colorado, on the other hand. This

application is restricted to providing service for only Time Warner Company, Scansco Management Company, Inc., and Antarctic Support Associates.

2. The Commission gave notice of the application on July 10, 1995.

An intervention opposing a grant of the application was filed by Yellow Cab Cooperative Association, doing business as Yellow Cab, Inc. ("Yellow Cab"), and its division, Denver Airport Limousine Service, Inc., doing business as Denver Airport Shuttle ("DASH").

3. By § 40-6-120, C.R.S., the application for temporary authority is under consideration for a Commission order.

4. Pursuant to § 40-6-120(1), C.R.S., the State Legislature has authorized the Commission to grant temporary authority when there appears to be "an immediate and urgent need to any point or within a territory having no carrier service capable of meeting such need."

5. The burden of proof created by this statute is indeed heavy. The Applicant must meet a two-fold test in order to satisfy the criteria demanded by the law. First, that there is an immediate and urgent need for the transportation services, and second, that there is no existing carrier capable of meeting the need. If the Applicant fails to meet either test, the application cannot be granted. The letters of support filed on behalf of this application indicate only that the companies supporting this

application would use the service if the permit were granted. The Commission finds that this does not satisfy the "immediate and urgent need" criteria demanded by the law. Further, the Commission cannot find that there is no other carrier service available in light of the intervention filed on behalf of Yellow Cab and DASH.

6. This application for temporary authority is not in the public interest and should be denied.

II. ORDER

A. The Commission Orders That:

1. This application is denied.
2. The 20-day time period provided by § 40-6-114(1), C.R.S., to file an application for rehearing, reargument, or reconsideration shall begin on the first day after the Commission mails or serves this decision.

B. This Order is effective on its Mailed Date.
