ORDER GRANTING MOTION

I. BY THE COMMISSION

A. Statement

1. On December 17, 2002, Qwest Corporation (Qwest) filed a Motion for Approval to Clarify and Revise the Colorado Performance Assurance Plan (CPAP) in the following manner: 1) Eliminate the Performance Indicator Definition (PID) MR-12 from the CPAP based upon changes to the Regional Oversight Committee (ROC) PIDS that are reflected in the ROC PIDS Version 5.0; 2) Revise Appendix B to reflect a three-day grace period that was originally a part of the negotiated PID PO-16 calculation for the CPAP; 3) Change the title of the MR-3 PID in the CPAP from "All Trouble Cleared within 24 Hours" to "Out of Service Cleared within 24 Hours" to match the ROC PID title for this measurement; and 4) Make a correction in the section numbering at page 23 of the CPAP. Qwest included with its filing the revised ROC PIDS Version 5.0 as Attachment 1 and a red-lined CPAP of Qwest's proposed revisions as Attachment 2.

2. Qwest requests that the Commission accept these changes to the CPAP. Qwest also requests that the Commission consider these changes to apply without further amendment to any CPAP Exhibit K to the Statement of Generally Available Terms and Conditions (SGAT) that

has been incorporated into any amended competitive local exchange carrier interconnection agreement.

3. On April 29, 2002, Qwest made a compliance filing pursuant to Decision No. R02-453-I in Docket No. 97I-198T. The filing consisted of the CPAP as Exhibit K to the SGAT, and the ROC PIDS version 4.1 as Exhibit B to the SGAT. Subsequent to this compliance filing, the ROC made changes to certain measurements, which are reflected in ROC PIDS Version 5.0, dated June 26, 2002. Qwest seeks to update its SGAT with the 14-State Section 271 PID Version 5.0 to replace the current effective Version 4.1.

4. None of the changes identified in Qwest's motion have been contested. The comment period on this motion has expired without any objections being filed by the parties. Qwest asserts that AT&T Communications of the Mountain States, Inc., and WorldCom, Inc., have been contacted about this filing and have stated that they have no objections.

II. ORDER

A. The Commission Orders That:

1. Qwest Corporation's Motion for Approval to Clarify and Revise the Colorado Performance Assurance Plan is granted.

2. This Order is effective on its Mailed Date.
