## I. <u>BY THE COMMISSION:</u>

## A. Statement, Findings and Conclusions

1. On July 16, 2004, COCA Healthcare Services Company (COCA Healthcare), filed an application for permanent authority to extend operations under Contract Carrier Permit No. B-9865 to include the transportation of passengers and their baggage: I. between all points in Jefferson County, State of Colorado; II. between all points in the Counties of Adams, Arapahoe, Denver and Jefferson, State of Colorado; and III. between all points in Larimer County, State of Colorado. This application is restricted as follows: 1. Item (I) is restricted to providing transportation services for clients of Jefferson County Human Services, Options for Long Term Care Division, 900 Jefferson County Parkway, Suite 100, Golden, CO 80401; 2. Item (II) is restricted to providing transportation services for clients of Senior's Resource Center, Adult Day & Respite Services Division, 3227 Chase Street, Denver, CO 80212; and 3. Item (III) is restricted to providing transportation services for clients of Larimer County Department of

Human Services, Seniors & Disabled Programs Division, 1629 Blue Spruce, Suite 209, Ft. Collins, CO 80524.

- 2. The Commission noticed this application to all interested persons, firms, and corporations pursuant to § 40-6-108(2), C.R.S., on July 26, 2004. The Commission set this matter for hearing on September 28, 2004.
- 3. No petition to intervene or otherwise participate in this proceeding has been filed. This proceeding is uncontested. Under § 40-6-109(5), C.R.S., this matter may be determined without a hearing.
- 4. The information submitted with this application warrants granting the requested extension.
- 5. A present and special need for the requested transportation services exists. A grant of the requested authority will not impair the efficient public service of any authorized common carrier providing a similar service.

## II. ORDER

## **A.** The Commission Orders That:

- 1. The hearing set for September 28, 2004, is vacated.
- 2. This application was deemed complete on September 1, 2004, within the meaning of § 40-6-109.5, C.R.S.
- 3. COCA Healthcare is authorized to extend operations under Contract Carrier Permit No. B-9865 as requested in this application.
- 4. The complete authority under Contract Carrier Permit No. B-9865, as extended, shall be as set forth in the Appendix and this Order is a PERMIT.

- 5. COCA Healthcare, as the holder of Contract Carrier Permit No. B-9865, shall operate in accordance with all applicable Commission rules and regulations.
- 6. COCA Healthcare shall file a proper tariff and pay the issuance fee and the appropriate vehicle identification fee. COCA Healthcare may not begin extended operations until these requirements have been met and it has received notice in writing form the Commission that it is compliance and may begin service.
- 7. If COCA Healthcare does not comply with the requirements of this Order within 60 days of its effective date, then the authority to extend operations shall be void. For good cause shown, the Commission may grant additional time for compliance if the request for additional time is filed within the 60 days.
- 8. The 20-day time-period provided by § 40-6-114(1), C.R.S., to file an application for rehearing, re-argument, or reconsideration shall begin on the first day after the Commission mails or serves this Order.

- 9. This Order is effective on its Mailed Date.

- D. against all service to, from, or between points in Jefferson County, Colorado, except for service to or from hospitals, medical clinics, therapy centers, rehabilitation centers, child development centers, schools, and daycare centers located in Jefferson County, State of Colorado.
- II. Transportation of passengers and their baggage, between all points in Jefferson County, State of Colorado.
  - Item II is restricted to providing transportation services for clients of Jefferson County Human Services, Options for Long Term Care Division, 900 Jefferson County Parkway, Suite 100, Golden, CO, 80401.
- III. Transportation of passengers and their baggage, between all points in the Counties of Adams, Arapahoe, Denver and Jefferson, State of Colorado.
  - Item III is restricted to providing transportation services for clients of Senior's Resource Center, Adult Day & Respite Services Division, 3227 Chase Street, Denver, CO, 80212.
- IV. Transportation of passengers and their baggage, between all points in Larimer County, State of Colorado.
  - Item IV is restricted to providing transportation services for clients of Larimer County Department of Human Services, Seniors & Disabled Programs Division, 1629 Blue Spruce, Suite 209, Ft. Collins, CO, 80524.
