I. BY THE COMMISSION:

A. Statement, Findings and Conclusions

1. On October 20, 2004 Senior Shuttle, Inc. doing business as Senior Shuttle (Senior Shuttle) filed an application for permanent authority to conduct operations as a contract carrier by motor vehicle for hire for the transportation of passengers and their baggage between all points located within the area: beginning at the intersection of 56th Avenue and Pena Boulevard; thence south on Pena Boulevard/Buckley Road as extended to its intersection with Belleview Avenue as extended; thence west on Belleview Avenue as extended to its intersection with University Boulevard; thence north on University Boulevard/York Avenue to its intersection with 56th Avenue as extended; thence east on 56th Avenue as extended to the point of beginning. This application is restricted to providing transportation services for passengers who are clients of the following named customers: (1) Russell Wm. Simpson, M.D., P.C. and Associates, 4896 Chambers Road, Denver, Colorado 80239; (2) Allcare Home Health, Inc., 10170 East Mississippi Avenue, Denver, Colorado 80247; (3) Rocky Mountain Internal Medicine, P.C., 1421 South

Potomac Street, Suite #130, Aurora, Colorado 80012; and (4) Louis A. Pokriefka, 10001 East Evans Avenue #53D, Denver, Colorado 80247.

2. The Commission noticed this application to all interested persons, firms, and corporations pursuant to § 40-6-108(2), C.R.S., on November 1, 2004. The Commission set this matter for hearing on January 4, 2005.

3. No petition to intervene or otherwise participate in this proceeding has been filed. This proceeding is uncontested. Under § 40-6-109(5), C.R.S., this matter may be determined without a hearing.

4. The information submitted with this application warrants granting the requested authority.

5. A present and special need for the requested transportation service exists. Granting the requested authority will not impair the efficient public service of any authorized common carrier providing a similar service.

II. ORDER

A. The Commission Orders That:

1. The hearing set for January 4, 2005 is vacated.
2. This application was deemed complete on December 7, 2004 within the meaning of § 40-6-109.5, C.R.S.
3. Senior Shuttle is granted authority to operate as a Class B contract carrier by motor vehicle for hire with authority as set forth in the Appendix. This Order is a PERMIT.
4. Senior Shuttle shall operate in accordance with all applicable Commission rules and regulations.

5. Senior Shuttle shall cause to be filed with the Commission certificates of insurance as required by Commission rules. Senior Shuttle shall file a proper tariff and pay the issuance fee and annual vehicle identification fee. Senior Shuttle may not begin operations until these requirements have been met and it has received notice in writing from the Commission that it is compliance and may begin service.

6. If Senior Shuttle does not comply with the requirements of this Order within 60 days of its effective date, then the authority to conduct operations shall be void. For good cause shown, the Commission may grant additional time for compliance if the request for additional time is filed within the 60 days.

7. The 20-day time-period provided by § 40-6-114(1), C.R.S., to file an application for rehearing, re-argument, or reconsideration shall begin on the first day after the Commission mails or serves this Order.

8. This Order is effective on its Mailed Date.
