**COMMISSION DECISION GRANTING
EXTENSION OF TIME**

I. BY THE COMMISSION

A. Statement, Findings, and Conclusions

1. This matter comes before the Commission for consideration of a filing submitted on April 14, 2020, by Control Group Productions (Applicant), requesting that the Commission grant an extension of 90 days to comply with the terms of Decision No. C20-0102 (Decision).

2. On December 23, 2019, Applicant filed an application for new permanent authority to operate as a common carrier of passengers by motor vehicle for hire.

3. The Commission noticed the application to all interested persons, firms, and corporations pursuant to § 40-6-108(2), C.R.S., on January 6, 2020. The proceeding was uncontested; and thus, it was determined without a hearing.

4. On February 14, 2020, the Commission issued the Decision and granted the permanent authority, subject to Applicant's full compliance with the requirements contained in Ordering Paragraph No. 3 of the Decision.

5. Ordering Paragraph No. 3 of the Decision requires Applicant to file proof of insurance; pay the motor vehicle fee and issuance fee; submit an advice letter with tariff and a vehicle inspection report; and, register with the Commission's electronic filing system.

6. The Decision gave Applicant 60 days from its effective date to comply with each of these requirements. However, the Decision also states that for good cause shown, the Commission may grant additional time for compliance, if the request for additional time is filed within 60 days of the effective date of the Decision.

7. The Decision became effective on February 14, 2020. Hence, Applicant had until April 14, 2020 to comply with the Decision or file a request for additional time.

8. The instant request for additional time was timely filed. It explains: "Due to the COVID-19 outbreak and governmental response, we have been unable to move forward with licensing and insuring the vehicle we have acquired for intended use under our newly granted operating authority."

9. The Commission concludes that good cause exists to extend the time for compliance with the requirements of the Decision for an extra 90 days.

II. ORDER

A. The Commission Orders That:

1. The request of Control Group Productions, filed on April 14, 2020, that the Commission grant an extension of 90 days for it to complete the requirements set forth in Decision No. C20-0102 is granted.

2. Control Group Productions is granted an extension of 90 days from the Mailed Date of this Decision to complete the requirements set forth in Decision No. C20-0102.

3. The 20-day time period provided by § 40-6-114(1), C.R.S., to file an application for rehearing, reargument, or reconsideration shall begin on the first day after the Commission mails or serves this Decision.

4. This Decision is effective on its Mailed Date.
