#### By the Commission:

Pioneer Trucking Company is now the owner of Certificate No. 616, which authorizes the transportation of milk from territory in Boulder, Larimer and Weld counties to Denver. In the instant application, which was heard at Denver, Colorado, on December 23, 1942, authority is sought to extend operations under said certificate to authorize the transportation of milk originating in Boulder and Jefferson counties, to Allenspark, and for the further transportation of said milk after processing from Allenspark to Buckley Field.

Testifying in his own behalf, one of the applicants stated that they owned two  $1\frac{1}{2}$ -ton refrigerated trucks, as well as one Dodge truck which was not refrigerated; that a refrigerated truck was necessary in the summertime to properly handle the operation in question; that no other trucker was authorized to perform this particular service, although authority did exist to transport milk from the originating territory to Denver; that applicants were now conducting the operation under temporary authority issued by the

Commission and after a contract had been let by the War Department upon bids that had been submitted.

It was further developed that the Ferncliff Dairy at Allenspark formerly only shipped its own product directly to Buckley Field, but the owner of said dairy had disposed of a portion of his herd, and that it was now necessary to transport other milk to said dairy in order to supply the amount of processed milk that Buckley Field requires. The round trip distance from where this milk is picked up in Jefferson County to Allenspark and to Buckley Field is approximately 164 miles.

The Federal Milk Administrator testified that he had been advised the requirements of Buckley Field amounted to 30,000 quarts of milk a month; that in his opinion this milk could just as well be processed in Denver and thus save the long haul to Allenspark and back. He read into the record a letter from the Surgeon General of the Army, one paragraph of which seems to express the attitude of that department upon the general question of milk supply for the Army. Said paragraph reads as follows:

"That in the interest of soldier morale the Army cannot afford to procure for troops milk of lower grade than that available to the majority of consumers in the nearby civilian community; and that in the interest of civilian morale the army cannot afford to commandeer its needs from the local high-grade supply and let the community satisfy its civilian needs as best it can."

The Milk Administrator further testified that while 37 per cent of the milk in the Denver area last December was used by commercial manufacturers, this had been reduced to less than 7 per cent, and that army demands, as well as civilian needs, were now being fully met for all fluid milk demands, although not the manufactured needs.

At the close of the hearing, counsel for applicants was advised that if he desired a further hearing in order to bring in additional testimony from the owner of the Ferncliff Dairy, or from the Army heads at Buckley Field, he should advise the Commission of his wish within ten days. This time has elapsed and no request has been made for such further hearing.

Upon the record as made, it would appear that the transportation of milk from the Denver milk producing area to Allenspark for the purpose of being processed, and then transporting that processed milk back to Buckley Field, is not economically sound, and no apparent need exists for such extensive handling of the product.

After careful consideration of the record, the Commission is of the opinion, and so finds, that the instant application should be denied.

As limited by the testimony offered at the hearing, applicant herein seeks authority to operate as a Class "A" private carrier by motor vehicle for hire for the transportation of general freight between Denver and Craig, over U. S. Highway No. 40, with the right to serve intermediate points on State Highway No. 131 and State Highway No. 11 between Steamboat Springs and Kremmling, via State Bridge and points on State Highway No. 297 to Dillon, and U. S. Highway No. 6 to the junction of said highway with U. S. Highway No. 40, with the right to serve between all intermediate points on said Highways Nos. 131, 11, 297, and 6.

The application was opposed by a number of certificated line haul carriers who furnish motor vehicle carrier service for the trans-

Larson Transportation Company also furnishes service, when required, to most of the points sought to be served by applicant on State Highway No. 131 south of Steamboat Springs.

It appeared that applicant has been operating under a Class "C" permit; that he purchases meats and potatoes in Denver, which he resells at a number of the points which he seeks to serve under a for-hire permit, chiefly Steamboat Springs and Oak Creek. Most of his customers are engaged in operating markets and restaurants. A number of them have asked him to haul eggs or some other commodity from Denver to their places of business for hire. ### STATEMENT

### By the Commission:

The above-styled matter was heard in Trinidad, Colorado, on January 22, 1943, pursuant to prior setting.

At the hearing, it developed that applicant herein seeks authority to operate a motor vehicle transportation service for the transportation of passengers between Trinidad, Colorado and the Army Detention Camp, located about ten miles from Trinidad, and intermediate points, and a motor vehicle transportation system for the transportation of passengers in city traffic over the public streets of the City of Trinidad, Colorado, although the last-mentioned service was not sufficiently described in the application to put interested parties on notice.

On motion, applicant was permitted to amend his application by interlineation by inserting the following allegation:

"That applicant also seeks authority to operate a motor vehicle transportation system for the transportation of passengers over public streets of the City of Trinidad, Colorado, for hire, such service to be limited to the streets and the number of schedules that may be established in franchise to be issued by the City; that applicant, informally, has been granted authority by the city to conduct said operation, as a trial operation, for a period of sixty days, and has been assured that franchise will issue in due time."

The hearing on the phase of the application seeking authority to serve in local city service was continued to some day to be hereafter fixed by the Commission, and hearing proceeded on the application for authority to serve between the City of Trinidad and said Army Detention Camp and intermediate points.

It appeared that the United States has recently constructed a detention camp, located about three miles south of Beshoar Junction, which is seven miles east of Trinidad, Colorado, on U. S. Highway No. 350. Highway between Beshoar Junction and the camp is not a public highway, and was constructed by the Government. When some fifty additional barracks buildings, which are about to be constructed, are completed, it is contemplated that the camp will house approximately five thousand prisoners of war or aliens whom the Government thinks it is desirable to place in a concentration camp, the capacity at this time being about thirty-five hundred. In addition, approximately five hundred soldiers will be stationed at the camp. It is necessary that some form of service, on schedule, be established, in order that workmen, soldiers, civilians, and prisoners may have means of travel between the camp and Trinidad. Applicant, at the time of hearing, contemplated filing a tariff fixing a rate of twenty-five cents one way and forty-five cents for round trip, with a reduction to soldiers -- probably twenty-five cents one way, and forty cents round trip. This, however, will be determined when tariff is formally submitted for approval of the Commission.

Protestant did not object to transportation by applicant of passengers between the camp and Trinidad, as limited to scheduled operations.

Upon careful consideration of the record, the Commission is of the opinion, and finds, that public convenience and necessity require the proposed operation of applicant for the transportation, on schedule, of passengers between Trinidad, Colorado, and the Army Detention Camp, located about ten miles from Trinidad, and intermediate points, and that certificate of public convenience and necessity should issue therefor.

### ORDER

#### IT IS ORDERED:

That public convenience and necessity require the meter vehicle operation of applicant, on schedule, for the transportation of passengers between Trinidad, Colorado, and the Army Detention Camp, located about ten miles from Trinidad, and intermediate points, and this order shall be taken, deemed and held to be a certificate of public convenience and necessity therefor.

The applicant shall file tariffs of rates, rules and regulations and time and distance schedules as required by the rules and regulations of this Commission within twenty (20) days from date.

The applicant shall operate his carrier system according to the schedule filed, except when prevented by Act of God, the public enemy, or extreme conditions.

This order is subject to compliance by applicant with all present and future laws and rules and regulations of the Commission.

That hearing on that part of said application asking for authority to conduct a motor vehicle common carrier service for the transportation of passengers, on schedule, over public streets in the City of Trinidad, Colorado, to be designated by the City of Trinidad, be, and the same hereby is, continued, date of hearing hereafter to be determined and fixed by the Commission.

The authority herein granted is subject to all applicable orders of The Office of Defense Transportation of the Federal Government.

This order shall become effective twenty (20) days from date.

#### By the Commission:

The above matter was heard at Denver, Colorado, on January 25, 1943.

Applicant seeks authority to perform a taxicab service for the transportation of passengers and their hand baggage between points in Ia Junta, Colorado, and between Ia Junta, Colorado, and points within a fifteen-mile radius thereof.

Applicant testified in support of his application that there is an Army Air Base within fifteen miles of La Junta; that seven or eight hundred men are now engaged in construction of highway and bridges within that area; that Swink is situated two miles from La Junta, and Rocky Ford eleven miles.

Applicant agreed to amend his application to provide for a rate of \$1.40, instead of \$1.05, for round trip between La Junta and Swink. The amendment was allowed, and having been made, the Denver-Colorado Springs-Pueblo Motor Way withdrew its protest to the application.

The applicant stated that there are about one-tenth enough cabs, including his own, to handle the necessary business in that area;

that the busses of Lenocker and McCune are not sufficient to take care of the air base. He also stated that he had authority from the Army to enter the air base.

Applicant, at present, has one 1941 six-passenger Mercury sedan, and three 1939 five-passenger Ford V-Eights.

Applicant's financial statement was made a part of the record, as was the proposed schedule of rates to be charged for the service proposed.

The operating experience and pecuniary responsibility of applicant were established to the satisfaction of the Commission.

The Commission finds that present and future public convenience and necessity require the operation of a taxicab service by applicant for the transportation of passengers and their hand baggage between
points in La Junta, Colorado, and between La Junta, Colorado and points
within a fifteen-mile radius thereof, and that certificate of public
convenience and necessity should issue therefor, subject to applicant's

To points not specifically enumerated - Twenty Cents (20¢) per leaded car mile.

#### STATEMENT

#### By the Commission:

On December 29, 1943, the Commission issued its order, on its own motion, for a hearing to be held in its Hearing Room, State Office Building, Denver, Colorado, at ten o'clock A. M., on January 26, 1943, for the purpose of revising its standards for signs and signals for railroad-highway grade crossings to be in accordance with the recommendations of the Joint Committee for Grade Crossing Protection of the Association of American Railroads, as set out in its Bulletin No. 3, at which time and place the same came on for hearing before the Commission.

The hearing was opened by a statement of the Commission's Railway and Hydraulic Engineer, outlining the proposed changes in the Commission's standards for signs and signals for railroad-highway grade crossings that would be necessary in case the recommendations of the Joint Committee for Grade Crossing Protection of the Association of American Railroads were adopted. This statement brought out some discussion as to the recommended use of reflectorized signs and the advisability of having all cross-buck signs on public highways reflectorized, but it appeared that the consensus was that the recommendations of the said Committee as to the optional use of reflectorized signs should be retained, as set out in Section 4 under the heading "Railroad-Highway Grade Crossing Signs", page 4 of Bulletin No. 3. There were also some other discussions as to the details of the signals, and some suggestions as to change in Section 16 under the heading, "Railroad-Highway Grade Crossing Signals", page 15 of Bulletin No. 3, to make the meaning clearer.

Mr. L. C. Heilman, Secretary of the aforesaid Committee, was called upon for an explanation of the proposed standards for signs and signals for railroad-highway grade crossings as given in Bulletin No. 3. He submitted a written statement which stated that Bulletin No. 3 is designed to revise and bring up to present practice those features that were

embodied in provious issues, and to present methods of protection that were not a part of former publications, such as automatic gates, suspended signs, and cantilever support for signals. He advised that the tentative draft of the proposed standards had been submitted to all the various motor vehicle associations, including the National Association of Railroad and Utilities Commissioners, and governmental authorities concerned in these signs and signals, and that practically all of them approved the proposed standards and only formal approval and adoption are necessary as American standard of the American Standards Association, and therefore will become the standards for the Association of American Railroads. These standards, therefore, have been subjected to such a careful check and scrutiny by the highest authorities concerned in this matter that they are entitled to the greatest respect. Mr. Heilman also stated that installation of reflectorized cross-buck signs will not be made mandatory by adoption of Bulletin No. 3; that the proposed standards do not require cross-buck signs to be placed on each side of the track, although, in his opinion, such practice would be desirable on public highways; that center of road installations had been rejected at conference as hazardous; that Rule 16, page 15, Bulletin 3, does not contemplate prohibition of shielding at sides which would shield lamp from engineer on approaching train, but was intended only to insure visibility of signal to traveler on highways approaching by vehicle or on foot; that one or two batteries can be used to operate highway crossing signals and highway gates mentioned in Rule 12, page 31 of the Bulletin "so long as it works," that is, so long as gate and signal operate independently; and that Commission will retain and have jurisdiction to make special provisions to cover particular cases.

Mr. Heilman's testimony appeared to clear up some questions of a minor technical character and the general opinion of all of the representatives of the various interests that were present, was that the standards for grade crossing signs and signals as proposed in Bulletin No. 3 should

be adopted as the standards for such signs and signals in this state.

The Commission, therefore, after hearing the evidence in this case and after carefully considering the recommendations of the Joint Committee on Grade Crossing Protection of the Association of American Railroads as to the standards proposed, is of the opinion and so finds:

- 1. That this hearing is for the purpose of revising the Commission's standards for signs and signals for railroad-highway grade crossings that were adopted by the Commission on the recommendation of the aforesaid Committee in Bulletin No. 1, and now said revision is to bring our standards up to the standards proposed in Bulletin No. 3.
- 2. That the changes proposed are in accordance with the best expert knowledge of men who are experienced in this matter, and that these proposed standards have been checked and approved by all the national organizations concerned, and therefore represent the best improved methods of protection of grade crossings known at this time.
- 3. That the Commission believes that the full purpose of this matter will be secured by the adoption of the standards recommended by this Committee in their entirety, as set out in Bulletin No. 3.

Therefore, in accordance with this finding, the Commission will now make its order.

#### ORDER

IT IS ORDERED, That in compliance with Section 29 of the Public Utilities Act, as amended, the standards as proposed in Bulletin No. 3 of the Joint Committee on Grade Crossing Protection of the Association of American Railroads for signs and signals, together with the specifications and practices of same, for railroad-highway grade crossings, be, and the same are hereby, approved and adopted as standard for all future installations or replacements, for all railroads operating in the State of Colorado, and for all others concerned therewith, until such time as further improvements or other conditions shall make a revision of said signs and signals necessary throughout the country, said signs

or signals as herein adopted to be installed as required at all new crossing installations and in replacements of any signs or signals new in use on account of wear, damage, or unfitness for proper service.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, That a copy of the aforesaid Bulletin No. 3 shall be attached to and become a part of this order.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, That the Commission reserves the right, on its own motion, or petition of any interested party, to make such variation in the standard signs and signals or practices herein adopted to cover any particular case where these standards would not adequately meet the conditions required, it being understood, however, that there should be as little sacrifice of conformity with the standards as possible.

#### By the Commission:

This matter was heard at Denver, Colorado, on November 19, 1942, and involves the abandonment of a spur railroad track at Niwot, Colorado, which connects, or was intended to connect, with the railway company's main track at a point about 842 feet southeasterly from the south corporate limits of Niwot, and extending northwesterly from such point of connection 410 feet. The track was originally built to serve the plant of the Niwot Alfalfa and Grain Milling Company, but no use has been made of it for more than a year prior to the filing of the petition on October 9, 1942, and the plant has been dismantled.

Dodd Brothers purchased the property in July, 1941, and the evidence disclosed that their business would be feeding stock, expecting to ship ten or twelve cars of stock a year. Their feeding operations are only about one-eighth of a mile from public stockyards.

It appeared from the evidence that the maintenance of this track would be purely for private purposes of Dodd Brothers, and these purposes were chiefly speculative on the business they hoped to develop.

The Commission finds that the present and future public convenience and necessity do not require the maintenance and operation of said spur track, and the same may be abandoned upon the effective date of this order.

#### By the Commission:

Applicant, Bennie Goldstein, doing business as "Goldstein Refrigerator Line," herein seeks authority to extend his private carrier operations under each of his Private Carrier Permits, Nos. A-469, A-787, and A-430, to include the right to serve the United States Air Base, located about seven miles east of Colorado Springs on Highway No. 24, and the United States Army Air Base, located twelve miles east of Pueblo, Colorado, on U. S. Highway No. %, from Denver, Colorado, for the transportation of fresh meat and packing house products (butter, cheese, eggs, and poultry), only.

The testimony discloses that he now is authorized to serve Colorado Springs and Pueblo; that he has refrigerated equipment, in which the commodities mentioned have been transported for his customers to Pueblo and Colorado Springs; that Gottula operates a line haul service east from Pueblo to the Pueblo Army Base and other points on U. S.

Highway No. 96; that open trucks, only, are operated by Gottula; that he had been hauling Armour Products to Pueblo, only, until about three weeks prior to the hearing, when he was authorized, temporarily, to serve the Pueblo Base, upon the representation that service was inadequate; that, when he instituted direct service from Denver to the Base, Cudahy Packing Company, which had been shipping Weicker-Gottula Truck Lines to the Base, shipped by his line.

- A. J. Baumann, Traffic Manager of Armour Packing Company. stated that the Government wanted refrigerated trucks, and that his company wanted Goldstein's service in order that it could obtain volume rates from Denver to the respective bases, inasmuch as his company enjoyed volume rates from Denver to Colorado Springs and to Pueblo: that beef for the Colorado Springs Air Base now was delivered to Union Ice and Fuel Company in Colorado Springs or Armour Branch, where the Army calls for it, beef not being under refrigeration after it leaves Goldstein's trucks; that beef over Gottula Line, and from Colorado Springs to the Colorado Springs Army Base is not "hung" or wrapped. He admitted that the Government pays the freight; that no complaints have been received by his company relative to service to Colorade Springs Air Base, nor to the Pueblo Air Base; that Weicker's service had been satisfactory to both points, the only question involved being that of rates for the service -- if call and demand service is a part of the movement; that Goldstein's service is always available to Armour, and Armour desires to consolidate Armour shipments to Pueblo and Pueblo Air Base, in order to obtain a cheaper rate.
- A. Buster, Local Traffic Manager of Cudahy Packing Company of Denver, stated that his company ships to both places; that Weicker and Gottula formerly handled to Pueblo; that, when temporary authority to serve the Pueblo Air Base issued to Goldstein, he shipped by Goldstein; that Gottula-Weicker service was satisfactory.
- A. J. Fregeau, for Weicker Transfer and Storage Company, testified in opposition. He stated that neither Weicker nor Gottula had been notified of issuance of temporary authority to Goldstein;

that it has authority to serve between Denver, Pueblo, and Colorade Springs, and has call and demand authority to serve from Pueblo and Colorado Springs to the respective bases which applicant seeks to serve; that it has refrigeration available in its plant at Colorado Springs, where perishables are stored; that freight for Pueblo Army Base ordinarily is delivered to Gottula at Pueblo by Weicker; that Gottula's territory is very sparsely settled; that he has operated for years with a minimum of business; that Gottula needs the business. and is entitled to it; that since Government pays the freight, carrier is not required to charge 120% of the line haul rate to Government Air Base; that, by arrangement with Gottula, Weicker sometimes handles truckloads without interchange at Pueblo directly from Denver to the Pueblo Air Base; that Weicker is now handling some traffic from Colorado Springs to the air base for Armour; that it has ample refrigerator equipment which can be used if required, although Government regulations do not require refrigeration to the camps, the only requirement being that commodities handled must arrive in good condition; that, in order to conserve tires and equipment and to comply with O.D.T. regulations, it is desirable that Weicker and Gottula continue to handle the traffic; that it has been serving adequately, and has moved several hundred thousand pounds of freight to the Pueblo Air Base directly and by combination with Gottula; that service is adequate, and loss of traffic would tend to impair the efficiency of the common carriers now serving.

After careful consideration of the record, the Commission is of the opinion, and finds, that the granting of the application would tend to impair the efficiency of the service of common carriers now adequately serving the camps applicant seeks to serve, and that said application should be denied.

S. Highway No. 6, between, and including, Dillon, Breckenridge and Kokomo; and (d) between Denver on the one hand, and, on the other, points within a radius of four miles of Kokomo; and (e) between Leadville and the Arkansas Valley Smelter, near Leadville, on the one hand, and, on the other, Wheeler, Frisco, Dillon, Breckenridge, and Kokomo, and points within a radius of four miles of Kokomo; said Schaeffer not having the right to serve points except those heretofore mentioned, and, under said decisions, did not and does not now have authority to serve between Leadville and Denver, or points west of Climax, out of Denver, or points east out of Leadville, except those specifically named in section (e) hereof.

Recently, the United States Government has constructed an Army camp at Pando, situated on U. S. Highway No. 24, which eliminates

through traffic over said highway between Dowd and Leadville, so that Denver and Leadville-bound traffic from Grand Junction now detours over U. S. Highway No. 6 between Wheeler and Dowd; that Rio Grande Motor Way, which formerly interchanged freight from Grand Junction with Schaeffer Truck Line at Leadville, now desires to interchange freight for said point at Frisco, where Schaeffer Truck Line maintains a dock. Schaeffer Truck Line operates occasional service between Leadville and Frisco, and is willing to handle said traffic into Leadville from Frisco, and is willing to accept freight from Motor Way at Frisco for other points on its line between Climax and Loveland Pass which it is authorized to serve.

It will also be observed that, under its authority, Schaeffer Truck Line does not have authority to serve point to point on its line between points Loveland Pass to Climax — that is, it cannot handle freight between Wheeler, Frisco, Dillon, Breckenridge, Kokomo, and Climax. Mr. Schaeffer represents that no one is now serving between the points mentioned; that, in his opinion, such service not only is desirable, but, in view of O.D.T. regulations and the rubber and motor vehicle shortage, is necessary. He asked that he be granted temporary authority to perform said service.

#### STATEMENT

#### By the Commission:

At the opening of the hearing, which was held in Fort Morgan, Colorado, on February 5, 1943, counsel for protestants stated for the record that no objections would be interposed to the closing of the Western Union telegraph station at Goodrich. The Commission was advised by letter from J. H. Musgrave, superintendent of Railway Mail Service, that no objection would be interposed on behalf of said service, provided that suitable arrangements were made to continue to handle the mail between the Post Office at Goodrich and the railroad station, and counsel for applicant stated that suitable arrangements already had been made to take care of handling the mail.

The evidence disclosed that Goodrich is a small station with a population of approximately fifty, located on what is known as the Julesburg branch of the Union Pacific Railroad, 16.4 miles west of Fort Morgan, Colorado. The only settlement at Goodrich consists of one general store and one garage.

It was further developed that the agent now employed at Goodrich is an experienced telegrapher and that a serious shortage of telegraphers

exists over the entire Union Pacific system. In this particular division, the Company is twelve men short of normal requirements, and in addition to this, 49 of the available telegraphers, of which 25 are below 38 years of age, are now on the deferment list of their various draft boards, and it is questionable how long such deferments will be extended. The Company is now training women for these positions and paying them \$100 per month while taking their course of instruction.

The expense of operating the station agency at Goodrich from December 1, 1941, to November 30, 1942, was \$1,777.64; total revenue derived from all sources for said station amounted to the sum of \$16,017.00.

It is proposed to substitute a custodian in lieu of the present agent, which would reduce the actual operating cost of the agency at Goodrich to the sum of \$246.00. Goodrich is on the Fort Morgan telephone exchange. Weldona, which is located 5.2 miles east of Goodrich, is also on this same exchange, and it is proposed that shipments into or out of Goodrich will be handled through the Weldona Station. A telephone at Goodrich is to be maintained by the railroad company in the station, and the custodian will have a key to the station, keep the same warm at necessary times, and generally assist patrons of the railroad at that point.

The principal shipments out of Goodrich consist of carload lots of sugar beets and livestock. The inbound shipments are light. It is conceded that so far as revenue is concerned, Goodrich justifies the maintaining of an agency. Two passenger trains, one east and one westbound, are now serving Goodrich. The eastbound train passes through at 5:52 P.M. and the westbound at 5:50 A. M. The eastbound train picks up most of the l.c.l. freight and cream destined to points west of Goodrich and takes the same to Sterling where it is transferred to the westbound train for final delivery. Train crews do this work, and it is proposed that they will continue to do so, and that the westbound train will stop on flag. The station agency at Weldona is open from 8:00 A. M. to 5:00 P. M. and the Fort Morgan station is open twenty-four hours a day.

It was further developed that due to O.D.T. regulations requiring a minimum load of 20,000 pounds in a car, the Union Pacific has made arrangements with North Eastern Motor Freight, Inc., to distribute its freight from Sterling to points intermediate between Sterling and La Salle, Colorado.

At the close of applicant's case, counsel for both applicant and protestants entered into a stipulation, subject to the approval of the Commission, that an order might be entered herein permitting applicant to close its agency station at Goodrich and substitute a custodian and caretaker in lieu thereof for the duration of the war and six months thereafter, provided that at the termination of said six months period, the railroad company would reinstate its agency station unless, sixty days prior to the termination of said six months, the railroad company should again apply to this Commission for authority to abandon said agency station.

Upon the record as made, the Commission approves said stipulation.

After a careful consideration of the record, the Commission is of the opinion, and so finds, that an order should be entered in conformity with the terms of said stipulation.

#### ORDER

#### IT IS ORDERED:

That Western Union Telegraph Company be, and it is hereby, authorized to close its station at Goodrich, Colorado.

That Union Pacific Railroad Company be, and it is hereby, authorized to abandon its agency station at Goodrich, Fort Morgan County, Colorado, and substitute in lieu thereof a custodian, subject to the following requirements:

That said Union Pacific Railroad Company shall maintain in its depot at Goodrich a telephone which shall be available to the patrons of said railroad company for any business purposes in connection with the railroad company;

That services of said custodian to be appointed shall be available

to the patrons of said railroad at Goodrich and he shall have a key to both the waiting room and freight depot and shall render such reasonable assistance to patrons of the railroad as occasion may require.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, That this order shall become effective on February 27, 1943, and shall remain in effect so far as Union Pacific Railroad Company is concerned for the duration of the war and a six-months period thereafter.

months period, Union Pacific Railroad Company shall restore its agency station at Goodrich unless on or before sixty days prior to the termination of said six months period, said Union Pacific Railroad Company shall apply to the Commission in this proceeding to again abandon its station agency at Goodrich, in which event said station agency need not be reinstated unless so required by order of the Commission at said time.

#### STATEMENT

### By the Commission:

This matter is before the Commission upon letters from The Denver and Salt Lake Railway Company, by F. J. Toner, its Traffic Manager, two dated February 10, 1943, and two dated February 12, 1943, requesting authority to transport two carloads of coal from Pinnacle, Colorado, one carload of coal from Oak Hills, Colorado, and one carload of coal from Mt. Harris, Colorado, free of charge, on account of charity.

The shipments in question have been donated by shippers on the line of The Denver and Salt Lake Railway Company, for use of agencies of The Denver War Chest, a charitable institution, and are to be used for charity.

Section 17, paragraph (c) of The Public Utilities Act provides that the Commission may, by rule or order, authorize carriers to depart from their published tariff rates.

After full consideration of the facts as set forth, the Commission finds that the request should be authorized.

Colorado, to Denver, Colorado, consigned to the Denver War Chest in care of the Barnett Fuel Company, Denver, Colorado; one carload of coal from Oak Hills, Colorado, consigned to the Denver War Chest in care of the United Fuel and Equipment Company, Denver, Colorado; and one carload of coal from Mt. Harris, Colorado, consigned to the Denver War Chest in care of the Colorado & Utah Coal Company, Denver, Colorado.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, That this order shall not be used as a precedent for other cases of a similar nature.



#### STATEMENT

#### By the Commission:

The above matter was heard at Denver, Colorado, on January 25, 1943.

Shortly thereafter, the Commission was advised by Richard E. Conour, Attorney for Edward T. Walker and James E. Ashton, common carriers in the San Luis Valley, that the above applicant was conducting operations between points in Saguache County and Camp Hale, at Pando, Colorado, and objection was made to such operations.

Upon receipt of this letter, the Commission learned that the said Ashton and Walker had not been notified of the setting of the application, as required by law, and notified Mr. Conour by letter to this effect.

The Commission is now in receipt of petition on behalf of Walker and Ashton to re-open said application, to hold further hearing, and to order that applicant be required to re-state all of the evidence in support of his said application; also to strike from the record all testimony received upon the hearing of said application on January 25, 1943.

The Commission finds, due to the facts above stated, that the petition to re-open should be granted, and that the requests of said petitioners should also be granted.

#### IT IS ORDERED:

That Application No. 6251-PP be re-opened for further hearing; that applicant be required to re-state all evidence in support of his application; that all evidence taken on January 25, 1943 in the hearing upon said application be stricken; that the said matter be set for further hearing at the Court House, Alamosa, Colorado, on the 11th day of March, 1943, at 10:00 o'clock A. M., and that all common carriers whose service might be impaired by reason of the granting of said application be duly and properly notified of the further hearing in said matter.

#### INVESTIGATION AND DUSPENSION DOCKET NO. 248

IT APPEARING, That on January 22, 1943, The Midland Terminal Railway Company, by its general manager, requested permission of the Commission to discontinue the operation of its passenger trains Nos. 1 and 2, and substitute in lieu thereof a combination freight and passenger train furnishing the same service to all communities along the line, although the schedule will be about two hours longer, said schedule to be effective on February 22, 1943, a copy of proposed schedule being attached to said application.

It was further alleged that since the Government had declared the gold industry to be non-essential during the present war emergency, all such operations had ceased since December 15, 1942, except for a skeleton operation to continue for a period of six months to furnish the ere necessary for refining zinc ore, as an experiment. It was stated that the company's main source of revenue is derived from hauling ore, and since this business has dropped off 69 per cent, it is necessary to curtail the expenses of operation to keep the line in operation and provide the necessary transportation to keep the gold industry alive in the territory served by the company.

IT FURTHER APPEARING, That on February 17, 1943, the Commission received a letter from the Superintendent of Schools in School District No. 1, protesting the aforesaid change in train service on account of the mail service that would be provided; also on February 18, 1943, the Commission received a petition signed by Mrs. Martha Nash and some 126

others without address, protesting the proposed change on account of the mail service to be provided by the new schedule:

IT FURTHER APPEARING, That the Commission finds the proposed change in train service of the said railway company might injuriously affect the rights and interests of said protestants or others that might be concerned;

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED, That the effective date for the proposed change in train service on said railway company be suspended for one hundred and twenty days from February 22, 1943, or until June 22, 1943, unless otherwise ordered by the Commission.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, That the matter of protests of the aforesaid protestants, or others concerned, is hereby set down for hearing before the Commission at Cripple Creek, Colorado, on the 5th day of March, 1943, at 1:30 o'clock P. M., at which time and place such evidence as is proper may be offered.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, That a copy of this order shall be filed with the aforesaid application for the proposed change in train service of the said Midland Terminal Railway Company, and copies hereof be forthwith served on W. H. McKay, General Manager of The Midland Terminal Railway Company, Colorado Springs, Colorado; A. D. Abbott, Superintendent of Schools, Cripple Creek, Colorado, and Mrs. Martha Nash, Cripple Creek, Colorado, for protestants.

#### STATEMENT

#### By the Commission:

As limited by the testimony and amendments of the application at the hearing in Pueblo, Colorado, on November 27, 1942, applicant herein seeks a certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate as a motor vehicle carrier for hire, on call and demand, for the transportation of: (1) Coal between points within a radius of one hundred miles of Pueblo, Colorado; (2) sand and gravel between points within a radius of fifty miles of Pueblo, and from points in said area to points in Las Animas County;

(3) road construction materials and contractors' incidental equipment, such as wheelbarrows, tools, forms, etc., of the type that can be loaded upon a dump truck, to and from and between construction jobs within a radius of one hundred miles of Pueblo; (4) cement from Portland to points in Las Animas and Huerfano counties, and to points in Pueblo County outside of the City of Pueblo; (5) lime from Pueblo and Manitou to points within a radius of one hundred and fifty miles of Pueblo, except to the City of Las Animas and points in Chaffee and Fremont counties and the south one-half of Lake County; (6) farm products, including livestock, from, to, and between points in that part of the area within a radius of 25 miles of Pueblo which lies north of Highway No. 50 and east of a point five miles west of Highway No. 85. and that part of said 25-mile radius which lies south of Highway No. 50 and east of the Colorado and Southern Railway Company right-of-way, which extends between Pueblo and Cedarwood; (7) tile pipe between points within a radius of twenty-five miles of Pueblo, and from the City of Pueblo, only, to points in the State of Colorado, excepting points in Chaffee, Fremont and Teller counties and the south one-half of Lake County, said tile moving to points out of said 25-mile radius to go to Government projects, only, for Standard Brick and Tile Manufacturing Company, and service between towns to be excluded.

In support of his application, applicant stated that, if the certificate sought is granted, his Private Carrier Permit No. B-1978 and the Private Carrier Permit of his brother, Frank Merrill Hardrick, No. B-1912, could be cancelled. A check of our records discloses that Private Carrier Permit No. B-1912 of Frank Merrill Hardrick was revoked on November 6, 1942.

Under Permit No. B-1978, Claude E. Hardrick is authorized to transport:

coal between points within a radius of 100 miles of Pueblo; sand and gravel between points within a 50-mile radius of Pueblo, and from points in said area to points in Las Animas County; road construction

materials and contractors' incidental equipment, such as wheelbarrows, tools, forms, etc., such as can be loaded upon a dump truck, between points within a radius of 100 miles of Pueblo; and cement from Portland to points in Huerfano and Las Animas Counties.

At the hearing, it developed that Mr. Hardrick has one semitrailer, two tandems, one straight truck, and two pickups, of the value of \$9,000.00, which have been used by him in conducting his Private Carrier and Commercial Carrier operations; that, as a commercial carrier, he has been moving from 500 to 600 tons of coal monthly during the winter, and 400 to 500 tons monthly during the summer; that frequently he has been asked to haul coal for hire, on occasions said requests being of an emergency character, but he has been unable to comply because person requesting service was not a contract customer of his; that, in the handling of sand and gravel, his experiencees have been substantially the same; that he does not propose to handle heavy machinery or contractors! heavy materials if he is authorized to handle road construction materials and equipment; that he contemplates service primarily to and for contractors at the job; that he has frequently been asked to handle cement for people whom he could not serve as customers, and who were unable to get common carrier service; that similar demands had been made for the transportation of lime, which he is not authorized to handle under his private carrier permit; that he moved great quantities of tile pipe for Gottula Trucking Company to La Junta, Avondale and Granada during the summer of 1942; that, being unable to handle tile pipe under his permit, he has leased a truck to the Standard Fire Brick Company, who has hauled its own pipe with his truck to the concentration camp near Trinidad; that during the summer he leased three trucks to Rio Grande Motor Way, Inc., they being used by said carrier for the transportation of pipe and other building materials to Pando; that, in his opinion, there will be a continuing demand for the transportation of tile pipe to Government projects in southern Colorado; that contractors want pipe moved by truck instead of by rail;

that as a commercial carrier, he has purchased considerable quantities of potatoes and peaches on the Western Slope, and has hauled them into Pueblo; that occasionally he has been asked to haul pears and some other commodities from the Western Slope into Pueblo for hire, but has been unable to furnish that service. It also appeared that the City of Pueblo charges a fee of \$150.00 for a license to sell farm products in Pueblo, and if he is authorized to haul for hire, it will not be necessary to purchase said license. He stated that he had received a number of calls from the section around the Huerfano River and the Broadacre district, south of Pueblo, to move livestock; that Nuckolls Packing Company has discontinued business at Pueblo, and livestock formerly moving to Pueblo now moves to other points, particularly to Denver, which has increased the movement of livestock by truck.

Roy E. Rush, manager of the Pueblo Lumber Company, testified that common carrier truck service for the movement of lime and coal is needed in the Pueblo area.

Earl Tomlinson, of Avondale, stated that he maintains sheds for the handling of cantaloupes, melons, and onions produced by himself and his neighbors in the Avondale area; that said commodities move out of the area to markets, chiefly to points west of Avondale; that there is some demand for movement of livestock in the areas where he does business, namely, Crowley and Pueblo counties.

The objections interposed by numerous protestants appearing at the hearing to the granting of the authority sought, except for the objections of J. S. Wright, were satisfied by amendments to the application, and Wes V. McKaughan, Ever-Ready Truck Service, Southwestern Transportation Company, Weicker Transfer and Storage Company, and the Common Carrier Division of The Colorado Motor Carriers! Association, withdrew their protests.

J. S. Wright, who operates a call and demand service under certificate of public convenience and necessity No. 1178 for the transportation of:

livestock, farm products, farm supplies, second-hand farm machinery, and used household goods, between points in Pueblo County, except that portion of said county which lies west of U. S. Highway No. 85 and south of the Arkansas River, and from and to points in said area, to and from points in the State of Colorado, without the right to serve between points served by motor vehicle carriers operating on schedule, and the transportation of construction equipment and supplies for the construction of farm reservoirs, ditches, etc., from farm to town, town to farm, and farm to farm, in Pueblo County,

opposed the granting of authority to Hardrick to transport livestock and farm supplies, except the transportation of farm products other than livestock, from points in the State of Colorado to points in the area he seeks to serve, and the transportation of the same commodities between points in said area during the harvest season, only. He contended that the service now afforded by authorized carriers for the movement of said commodities is adequate; that Wes V. McKaughan's five trucks, J. D. Green's four trucks, three trucks that belong to him, the trucks of the Southwestern Transportation Company, and the equipment of a number of private carriers, are available for the handling of livestock and farm products in the area; that while there has been some increase in livestock business on account of the closing of Nuckolls Packing Company's plant at Pueblo, said increase is chiefly limited to movement of hogs; that movement of other farm produce to points outside area is limited; that he needs the business which will develop in his territory, especially movement of seed to make up full loads and to keep going; that while he and other carriers have been rushed at times, they have been taking care of the movement of all farm products satisfactorily; that he has never turned anyone down; that Hardrick has large and good equipment, and undoubtedly would take some business from him, which would impair the efficiency of his service; that in addition to the other carriers mentioned, W. G. Cressey and Ted Gibbons, as call and demand common carriers, are authorized to perform the same service that applicant seeks to perform; that Gibbons is not now serving actively, and desires to sell his certificate; that Cressey is located at Avondale and, for

the most part, hauls water; that, in his opinion, common carrier service would offer far stronger competition to his service than the private carrier service furnished by applicant in the past.

The Commission recently had occasion to consider the application of Louis Klamm, of Avondale, Colorado, for the transportation of farm products, including livestock, and wool in grease, between points within the area extending from Pueblo twenty miles east, twenty miles west, thirty-five miles south, ten miles north, and from and to points in said area, to and from points in the State of Colorado, without the right to serve between points served by motor vehicle line haul common carriers. It would seem that in view of our decision in that matter (Dec. 18700, Application No. 5861) upon application for authority similar to that sought herein, it is not necessary to discuss the testimony or the applicable law in this decision, inasmuch as we have reached the same conclusion herein. We there cited our Decision No. 6846, in Re Application No. 2621 of H. P. Lahs, where we said:

"The Commission, on a number of occasions, has held that an applicant, in order to secure a certificate of public convenience and necessity, must affirmatively show that the public convenience and necessity, as distinguished from his personal desires, requires his proposed operation, and that before a certificate of public convenience and necessity will issue for an operation which will virtually parallel existing common carrier service, a clear and affirmative showing must be made that the existing transportation facilities are inadequate or unsatisfactory, and that there is no prospect of such service being made better under the orders of the Commission. Re Roy A. Newton, 9 Colo. PUC 170; S. W. Tr/ Co. vs. Weicker Tr. Co. et al, 9 Colo. 447; Re Calvin L. Holcomb, Colo. PUC Decision No. 6118."

Therefore, after careful consideration of the record, the Commission is of the opinion, and finds, that public convenience and necessity require the proposed motor vehicle common carrier service, on call and demand, of applicant, for the transportation of coal, sand, gravel, road construction materials, etc., cement, and lime, as sought under the amendments to the application made at the hearing, and the transportation

of farm products, excluding livestock, from points in the State of Colorado to points within that part of the area within a radius of 25 miles of Pueblo which lies north of Highway No. 50 and east of a point five miles west of Highway No. 85, and that part of said 25-mile radius which lies south of Highway No. 50 and east of the Colorado and Southern Railway Company right-of-way, which extends between Pueblo and Cedarwood; and, the transportation of farm products, except livestock, between points in said areas lying north and south of Highway No. 50 during the harvest season, only; and the transportation of livestock between points in that part of the above-described areas which lie west of U. S. Highway 85 and south of the Arkansas River, and from and to points in said area to and from points in the State of Colorado, except service to or from that part of Pueblo County which lies north of the Arkansas River and east of Highway 85; and that certificate of public convenience and necessity should issue therefor; that said application, in all other respects, should be denied; that Private Carrier Permit No. B-1978 should be cancelled.

#### ORDER

#### IT IS ORDERED:

That public convenience and necessity require the motor vehicle common carrier service, on call and demand, of applicant for the transportation of: (1) coal between points within a radius of one hundred miles of Pueble; (2) sand and gravel between points within a radius of fifty miles of Pueblo, and from points in said area to points in Las Animas County; (3) road construction materials and contractors' incidental equipment, such as wheelbarrows, tools, forms, etc., of the type that can be loaded upon a dump truck, to, from and between construction jobs within a radius of one hundred miles of Pueblo; (4) cement from Portland to points in Las Animas and Huerfano Counties, and to points in Pueblo County outside of the City of Pueblo; (5) lime from Pueblo and Manitou to points within a radius of one hundred and fifty miles of Pueblo, except to the city of Las Animas and points in Chaffee and Fremont Counties and the south one-

half of Lake County; (6) farm products, excluding livestock, from points in the State of Colorado to points within that part of the area within a radius of 25 miles of Pueblo which lies north of Highway No. 50 and east of a point five miles west of Highway No. 85, and within that part of said 25-mile radius which lies south of Highway No. 50 and east of the Colorado and Southern Railway Company right-of-way which extends between Pueblo and Cedarwood; and the transportation of farm products, except livestock, between points in said area lying north and south of Highway No. 50 during harvest season, only; and the transportation of livestock between points in that part of the above-described areas which lie west of U. S. Highway 85 and south of the Arkansas River, and from and to points in said areas to and from points in the State of Colorado, except service to or from that part of Pueblo County which lies north of the Arkansas River and east of Highway 85; and this order shall be taken, deemed and held to be a certificate of public convenience and necessity therefor.

Applicant shall file tariffs of rates, rules and regulations as required by the rules and regulations of this Commission within twenty days from date.

Applicant shall operate his carrier system in accordance with the order of the Commission except when prevented by Act of God, the public enemy, or extreme conditions.

This order is subject to compliance by applicant with all present and future laws and rules and regulations of the Commission

The authority herein granted is subject to all applicable orders of the Office of Defense Transportation of the Federal Government.

That said application, in all other respects, should be, and the same hereby is, denied.

That Private Carrier Permit No. B-1978 should be, and the same hereby is, cancelled and revoked.

That this order shall become effective twenty (20) days from date.

#### STATEMENT

#### By the Commission:

At the opening of the hearing, which was held in Cortez, Colorado, on February 17, 1943, applicant stated that the word "commodities", as set forth in his application, would be limited to farm supplies. He further stated that he proposed no service in competition with presently established line-haul operations.

It was further developed that applicant conducts a grocery store and gas station at Cahone, which is located on Highway 160, approximately

nine miles south of Dove Creek, Colorado; that no local truckers furnishing a farm service are now operating in this territory, and applicant feels that his proposed service is vitally needed in said area.

The Highway Patrolman who covers said area advised the Commission in writing that the proposed service was "sorely needed".

The financial standing and operating reliability of applicant were established to the satisfaction of the Commission.

No evidence was submitted at the hearing by any of the protestants present.

After a careful consideration of the record, the Commission is of the opinion, and so finds, that, as limited by the testimony, the authority sought should be granted.

#### ORDER

## 1T IS ORDERED:

That William McCormick, of Cahone, Colorado, be, and he is hereby, authorized to operate as a Class "B" private carrier by motor vehicle for hire for the transportation of farm products (including livestock) and farm supplies from point to point within a 20-mile radius of Cahone, Colorado, including the right to transport said commodities from and to points within said 20-mile radius of Cahone on the one hand, to and from Durango and Denver on the other hand; provided, however, that under said in-and-out authority, applicant's transportation of farm supplies from Durango and Denver shall not include any town to town service in competition with presently established common carrier service.

Your petitioner bases this request upon the following facts which present certain special circumstances and conditions justifying the request herein made:

In publishing Colo. P.U.C. No. 2, for account of participating carriers named therein, your petitioner, as the suggestion of said carriers, duplicated the rail rates from and to the same points. Since that time, and after having applied the rates for a period of approximately two months, the carriers have found in many instances that the rates published are not satisfactory insofar as motor vehicle operations are concerned.

Operating conditions and other factors have made it impossible for the motor carriers to operate profitably between several points on the low basis of rates now in effect; also, in two instances the published rates have proved to be too high and adjustment is being made at this time.

The following is a brief statement of the proposed changes:

Increase rates to 23 points; Reduce rates to 2 points; Eliminate all rates from Colorado Springs; Eliminate a portion of the rates to 24 destination points; Eliminate all rates to 17 destination points; Add 6 destination points; Add Shamrock as a point of origin with rates to 272 points.

Your petitioner represents that no useful purpose will be served by indicating all proposed increases, reductions, changes and additions, and that to do so, as required by Rule 36(I), will be an unnecessary burden upon your petitioner and will add to the tariff information which will be confusing to both shippers and carriers.

Your petitioner further represents that distribution of the new issue will be made to all interested parties in ample time for them to have an opportunity to make a check of the proposed rates and, if they desire, file their objections to same with this Commission before the effective date.

Therefore, your petitioner respectfully prays that this Honorable Commission grant the authority herein requested.

#### STATEMENT

## By the Commission:

By application filed January 7, 1943, Rocco Di Paolo sought authority to operate as a common carrier by motor vehicle for hire for the transportation of:

passengers between Trinidad and Army Detention Camp, located about ten miles by road from Trinidad, Colorado, and intermediate points.

Subsequently, he was permitted to amend his application to include a request to operate a motor vehicle transportation system for the transportation of passengers over public streets of the City of Trinidad, Colorado, for hire, such service to be limited to the streets and the number of schedules established in franchise to be issued by said City.

Hearing was had on January 22, 1943, at Trinidad, Colorado, upon the request to inaugurate common carrier bus service between Trinidad and the Army Detention Camp, the application for the right to establish motor bus service over the streets of Trinidad being continued for further hearing. On February 2, 1943, certificate issued, authorizing service between Trinidad and said Detention Camp and intermediate

points.

Application to inaugurate bus service in Trinidad was heard on February 23, 1943, at Trinidad, Colorado.

At the hearing, J. A. Storm, Mayor of Trinidad, testified that, as Mayor, he has been attempting to interest some operator in conducting a motor bus line for the transportation of passengers for hire over one or more routes in said city, said busses to stop at any and all street intersections along the routes for the purpose of discharging and receiving passengers; that, for many years prior to about two years ago, a bus line had been operated in Trinidad; that service was discontinued on account of inability to operate the line at a profit; that, in his opinion, the situation has changed materially; that bus service is badly needed; that, due to rationing of gas and scarcity of tires, a great number of people who formerly drove their own automobiles about the city on business or pleasure now want a for-hire service; that a detention camp has been established by the Government southeast of Trinidad: that a considerable number of civilian and Army personnel and their families reside in the city, and desire to use the bus line from Trinidad to the camp; that they need street bus service to get to and from the bus station; that he had requested Fouret Brothers, who operate a taxicab service in Trinidad, to start a line between Trinidad and the camp, and to inaugurate bus service in Trinidad, but was unable to interest them in either proposition; that Di Paolo, at his request, had applied for, and obtained, a certificate to operate between Trinidad and the camp, and he was of the opinion that the application to serve in the City of Trinidad should be granted.

James Ingles, City Clerk, read into the record two resolutions adopted by the City Council — one on January 11, 1943, the other on January 25, 1943. By these resolutions, the city sought to grant a permit to Rocco Di Paolo to use the streets temporarily for operation of a bus line to serve people in the city until such time as a formal franchise could be drawn and passed authorizing such service. Mr. Hall, as counsel for Fouret Brothers, objected to the introduction of said resolutions, upon the ground that they did not serve to establish a right

to use of city streets; that such right could be obtained only by formal franchise passed by ordinance.

Mr. Di Paolo stated that he is now operating three school busses between the City of Trinidad and the Army Detention Camp; that he has purchased a Mack Coach for \$1600.00, which he expects to use in his operation over the city streets; that a ten-cent fare will be charged for the service; that, by reason of experience in operating a taxi service for a number of years, he believes himself to be qualified to conduct the proposed operation; that, as yet, he does not have formal authority from The Office of Defense Transportation to conduct the operation, but that he and the City of Trinidad have requested such authority; that, in his opinion, he will receive the same in due time.

Mr. Hall objected to the granting of the certificate on the ground that it had not been shown that public convenience and necessity required the operation, and that applicant did not have the right to operate over the city streets, and had failed to secure authority from The Office of Defense Transportation to conduct said operation.

It would seem the testimony of the Mayor of the City of Trinidad that the City and the public desire the operation of Di Paolo, and that said service is needed to satisfy the transportation requirements of the people of the City of Trinidad, is sufficient in the absence of evidence to the contrary to establish public convenience and necessity.

Moreover, the Commission, as a matter of general information, knows that some form of mass transportation is now required in many communities where formerly people were able to get along with owner passenger cars, and that, too, it is the desire of Government rationing agencies that residents of cities use mass transportation, rather than to drive their own cars.

Applicant, of course, cannot operate without the consent of The Office of Defense Transportation. Also, he must secure the consent of the City of Trinidad before starting bus operations over the streets. Whether this sould be obtained formally by franchise or resolution, or both, is a legal question which we cannot determine.

After careful consideration of the record, the Commission is

of the opinion, and finds, that present and future public convenience and necessity require the granting of the instant application, and that certificate of public convenience and necessity should issue for such operation.

## ORDER

#### IT IS ORDERED:

That public convenience and necessity require the operation of a motor vehicle transportation system, on schedule, by Rocco Di Paolo, Trinidad, Colorado, for the transportation of passengers for hire over public streets of the City of Trinidad, Colorado, such service to be limited to the streets and the number of schedules that may be designated by the City Council, with the right to stop at any and all street intersections along the said routes for the purpose of discharging and receiving passengers, and with authority to extend said service from time to time as the Council may require or allow, and the development of the city or its business may make necessary, and this order shall be taken, deemed and held to be a certificate of public convenience and necessity therefor.

The applicant shall file tariffs of rates, rules and regulations and time and distance schedules as required by the rules and regulations of this Commission within twenty (20) days from date.

The applicant shall operate his carrier system according to the schedule filed except when prevented by Act of God, the public enemy or extreme conditions.

This order is subject to compliance by applicant with all present and future laws and rules and regulations of the Commission.

The Commission, by Decision No. 13104, on February 28, 1939, determined that August Scheirman, of Longmont, Colorado, is authorized under his Class "B" private carrier permit No. B-637 to transport:

cement, building materials, household goods, farm equipment and farm products, including livestock, from point to point within the area extending nine miles east and seven miles west of Stratton, Colorado, and the Kit Carson County Lines on the north and south; cement and plaster from Portland, Colorado, and building materials from Pueblo, to Stratton; household goods and farmers' equipment (when moving a farmer) from and to points in said area, to and from points in the State of Colorado; and livestock from and to points in said area, to and from points in the State of Colorado, and that authority, if any he had, to furnish any service other than that hereinbefore set forth, under said permit be, and the same hereby is, cancelled.

Said Scheirman now seeks authority to transfer said permit to F. W. Clevenger, Seibert, Colorado.

At the hearing, at Denver, Colorado, on December 29, 1942, it developed that, for approximately three years last past he has

not furnished any intrastate transportation service to any customers under his permit; that his hauling activities have been limited to interstate service; that, occasionally, he has permitted truckers in the area covered by his authority to furnish service under his permittat is, loaned them the use of his number; that transferee Clevenger did some hauling under the permit during the summer and early fall of 1942; that he has lived at Longmont or Boulder for five years, and has not maintained a truck in the area for service under the permit; that he effered the permit to Bertie Towers; that Towers told him he was unable to use it with a common carrier certificate.

A check of applicant's reports confirms his statement as to non-use of the permit, and shows that the transportation furnished by Clevenger when applicant loaned him the use of his authority was limited to the transportation of coal in the immediate vicinity of Seibert.

Transferee F. W. Clevenger, for himself, stated that he had not been experating under Scheirman's permit; that, in the event he acquires the permit he desires to engage in all transportation service in terms authorized under it, and that he does not intend to limit his operation to the transportation of coal, or to service in the immediate vicinity of Seibert.

Bertie Towers, who, under PUC No. 912, has authority to conduct irregular transportation of:

farm products, livestock, farm supplies (lumber out of Burlington) farm equipment and used furniture out of, into, and between points within the following area: from Burlington, Colorado, 35 miles north; west to a point 5 miles west of Stratton; south to the Kit Carson County line, and east to the Colorado-Kansas State Line,

opposed the granting of authority to transfer the permit. He stated that applicant had not served in the territory for about four years; that he had not seen a truck of Scheirman's passing through Burlington

for about eight months; that he had been furnishing adequate service in the territory for all persons desiring for-hire service; that farmers have not complained; that a number of other carriers have authority to serve, and they and he need all the business they can get in order to keep going and to furnish the service on call and demand that people in the territory need; that to grant the authority sought, and thereby, in effect, institute a new operation, not limited to the service furnished by the permit-holder in the past, would tend to impair the efficiency of his service, and that of other common carriers now adequately serving the territory.

It would seem that, in view of the fact that Scheirman has not conducted for-hire operations in the territory in question for a number of years, it would not be fair to his competitors or in the public interest to, in effect, institute a new operation by authorizing him to transfer his permit to F. W. Clevenger, who proposes, if he acquires the permit, to operate in a large way within the full scope of the permit as granted.

Therefore, after careful consideration of the record, the Commission is of the opinion, and finds, that the authority sought should be denied.

#### ORDER

## IT IS ORDERED:

That the application of August Scheirman, Greeley, Colorado, to transfer Permit No. B-637 to F. W. Clevenger, Seibert, Colorado, should be, and the same hereby is, denied.

This order shall become effective twenty days from date.

Clayton Hill herein seeks authority to transfer Private Carrier Permit No. B-2012 to Roy Kohl. Under said permit, he is authorized to operate as a private carrier by motor vehicle for hire for the transportation of:

## By the Commission:

By Decision No. 2556, of date September 30, 1929, William Troxler and T. G. Nies were authorized to transport:

milk to Denver from the area described as: beginning where Pecos Street crosses the North Denver City Limits, thence north 11 miles; thence west 7 miles; thence south  $7\frac{1}{2}$  miles; thence east 4 miles to the Adams-Jefferson County Lines; thence south to the Denver City Limits.

By Decision No. 15666, of date July 13, 1940, said authority was transferred to William Troxler, and his authority was extended under his Certificate No. 422 to transport:

milk to Denver from additional territory lying immediately north of the territory aforedescribed, said addition being described as: commencing at the East Quarter Corner of Section 21, Township 1-South, Range 68-West; thence north  $2\frac{1}{2}$  miles to the Bridge Street Road; thence west 4 miles; thence south  $2\frac{1}{2}$  miles to the West Quarter Corner of Section 24, Township 1-South, Range 69-West, being the north line of applicant's present authorized territory; thence east 4 miles to the point of beginning,

with the proviso that no authority thereby was granted:

"to serve milk producers residing along the highway (Pecos Street extended) as the same runs along the east side of the North Half of Section 21 and the east side of Section 9 and 16, which milk producers, and the territory contiguous to and along said highway, are served by Alex Laubhan, Jr."

Applicant William Troxler now seeks to transfer said certificate to Anthony Tisone, William T. Bullard, Don Tisone, and John J.Tisone, copartners, doing business as "Pioneer Trucking Company."

At the hearing, in Denver, Colorado, on February 26, 1943, it appeared that Troxler has no outstanding unpaid obligations against said operation; that the consideration for the transfer of the certificate and some equipment is \$4,000.00; that transferees are ready, able and qualified to carry on the Troxler operation, in addition to their already authorized service; that said service has been conducted by Anthony Tisone, William T. Bullard and Don Tisone; that John J. Tisone is a recent addition to the firm, and expects to actively engage in the operation of said milk route; that transferees desire that his name be incorporated as one of the owners of their current operation under PUC No. 616; that they do not want to dispense with the use of the certificate number "422," but do desire authority to conduct the two operations as one, and to make only one report for the combined operations under PUC Nos. 422 and 616.

For Alex Laubhan, Jr., it appeared that he conducts a milk haul service from points within an area extending north from Denver, which, in part, adjoins the territory of Troxler on the east; that Troxler's certificate was issued a short time prior to the issuance of Laubhan's certificate; that, when issued, the Laubhan certificate permitted Laubhan to serve from farms within a strip of land one-half mile in width immediately west of Pecos Street, and extending from the south township line of

Township 1-South to the Quarter Corner of Sections Nos. 3 and 10, Township 1-South, which was included in the Troxler territory, said Troxler not objecting thereto; that, since the issuance of the Laubban certificate, except for service to one shipper, who wanted milk taken to dairy Laubhan did not want to serve, Troxler has not served from said one-half-mile strip which lies immediately west of Pecos Street; that, when Laubhan agreed to serve the customer as desired, customer was relinquished by Troxler, and Laubhan has handled his milk since said time. Mr. Allen, for Laubhan, contended that Troxler had abandoned his authority or right to serve said territory. Troxler denied that he had intended to, or had, abandoned his right to serve said territory; that the service to the one customer mentioned was recent; that he had not served prior to said time because farmers residing in this strip had been adequately served by Laubhan, and it was not until Laubhan refused to serve the customer in the manner the customer required, that he served him.

After careful consideration of the record, the Commission is of the opinion, and finds, that the question of whether there has or has not been an abandonment by Troxler, and his right to serve in the one-half-mile strip mentioned by Mr. Laubhan where Laubhan's certificate overlaps Troxler's certificate, is a question that cannot be settled in the instant proceedings; that if Laubhan desires to prosecute the matter further, he should file an abandonment proceedings to determine the question; that the authority sought to transfer should be granted; that our records and files in PUC No. 616 should be amended and changed by incorporating the name of John J. Tisone as one of the co-partners owning and operating Pioneer Trucking Company, so as to show that said certificate is owned and operated by Anthony Tisone, William T. Bullard, Don Tisone, and John J. Tisone, co-partners, doing business as "Pioneer Trucking Company."

## STATEMENT

## By the Commission:

As limited by the amendments to the application at the hearing, applicant herein seeks authority to operate as a common carrier by motor vehicle, on call and demand, for the transportation of: (1) hay, straw, and livestock between Denver, Golden, Divide, and Colorado Springs on the one hand, and, on the other, ranches in that part of Park County, Colorado, located west of a north and south line fifteen miles east of the Town of Jefferson; (2) repair parts for farm machinery, livestock feeds, salt, coal, and farm supplies, generally, from Denver, Divide, and Colorado Springs, to ranches in said area in said Park County.

At the hearing, in Denver, Colorado, on November 20, 1942, it developed that applicant has been operating for a number of years as a Class "B" private carrier by motor vehicle for hire for the transportation of:

livestock from points within a fifteen-mile radius of Jefferson to Littleton, Golden, Denver, and Divide; hay from points in said area to Littleton, Golden and Denver; wool from said area to Colorado Springs; grain, machinery, and rapair parts from Littleton, Golden and Denver, coal from northern Colorado coal fields, oil cake from Colorado Springs, to points in said area;

that, when his application for a certificate of public convenience and necessity was filed, he was granted authority by the Commission to operate, pending hearing;

that he has been unusually busy, having hauled between 7,000 and 8,000 sheep, 2,000 cattle, some hay and a few horses during the Fall months prior to the hearing; that the demand for his service seemed to be continuous, and perhaps, in a measure, was due to the fact that Gately Motor Company advertised that it was unable to haul livestock during the Fall, on account of having equipment on work previously contracted and inability to get drivers; that while Gately may have authority to serve ranches in the area he seeks to serve directly, to the best of his knowledge, the service of said carfier has been limited to the hauling in of supplies to Alma, Fairplay, and other towns on its line haul route between Denver, Alma and Fairplay and intermediate points, where farmers must call for freight; that, on return loads from Denver and other points served by applicant, he has hauled salt, straw, grain, oil cake, and other feeds, repair parts for machinery, and considerable coal, some coal also being handled under a Commercial Carrier Permit; that farmers also require other supplies. such as farm machinery, building materials, fencing, etc. He stated that he was pecuniarily able to purchase additional equipment, if needed, and if the equipment is available; that he could, at the time of hearing, purchase two trucks from neighbors. A financial statement furnished by him showed net assets in excess of \$40,000.00. He has found it unsatisfactory to operate under his Private Carrier Permit because he has not been able to serve all the ranchers in or out of his territory desiring his service. Moreover, cake and other supplies are shipped in carloads to Colorado Springs or other points, and he should be able to distribute the entire load. In the past, he has been able to handle the portion going to ranchers who are his customers, and who reside in the territory he is entitled to serve, but has not been able to haul cake to ranchers living outside the fifteen-mile radius of Jefferson, who have been compelled to do their own hauling. The Office of Defense Transportation has insisted that he and all truckers obtain backhauls when possible. Movement of supplies infrequently could be handled as a backhaul. Upon cross-examination, he admitted that Gately could have handled the cake and grain distributed by him from carload lots, and that the granting of authority to him might mean that Gately would lose some backhaul business. Also that, so far as he knew, Gatelyhad been able to handle farm machinery adequately - at least he had not heard complaints.

In addition to his transportation business, which he has conducted in the past and proposes to operate in the future, applicant is a rancher in a substantial way in Park County. He knows ranchers' problems, and thinks that his neighbors should be able to get the same type of service that he, in the past, has furnished his ranch.

George M. Teeter, of Fairplay, who operates a number of ranches in the South Park area, and has a garage at Fairplay, testified for applicant. He has a ranch four miles southeast of Fairplay, to which he personally has moved cake from Jefferson, where it was left by Shattinger, who handled it out of Denver. He hauls his own coal. Although he knew Gately moved farm supplies on his line haul service from Denver to Fairplay, he has been under the impression that Gately did not deliver at ranches, and he, personally, has hauled his supplies from Fairplay to the ranch. Witness sells farm machinery repair parts at his station in Fairplay. They have been hauled by Gately from Denver in the past. Upon cross-examination, he stated that Gatelys' service, insofar as demands have been made upon him, has been good; that, so far as he knew, Gately had never held himself out to deliver to ranches from Fairplay or elsewhere; that Shattinger, in his opinion, besides desiring to furnish a farm service (Gately being interested in line haul service and transportation of commodities other than farm products and farm supplies), is better equipped and better qualified to furnish a farm service.

A. L. Archer, who resides on a ranch three and one-half miles south of Jefferson, a County Commissioner of Park County, also testified in support of the application. It was his opinion that more transportation service is needed in the area east and south of Fairplay. Very few farmers have trucks, and apparently no one is actively engaged in furnishing for-hire service in said territory, or find it impracticable to haul "short loads" - a bull for instance. He stated that most of the ranch area lies north, northeast, south and southeast of Fairplay, although a few ranches are located in the area southwest of Fairplay. Similar views were voiced by F. C. Vanderbur, a new comer, in the Park who resides near Jefferson on a ranch. He produces hay, cattle and horses.

Louis Ballengren, for thirty years a resident of South Park, lives on a ranch nine miles south of Fairplay, and about the same distance west of Hartsel. He is a stock grower, and a State Brand Inspector. Up to the time of hearing, so far as he knew, no one had been offering a direct supply-point-to-ranch for-hire service in the ranch area between Como, and the south and of the Park. He believes such service is needed during normal times, and believes the need to be more acute at this time on account of the fact that a great number of ranchers who formerly hauled their livestock and farm supplies are not now able to do so. He has never heard any complaints about the Gately service, as offered, and personally has found it to be satisfactory. Gately hauled a hay stacker from Denver to Fairplay for him. Witness then hauled from Fairplay to his ranch. From time to time, he has known Denver carriers to haul livestock in or out of the Park.

E. A. Sanborn, of Jefferson, a rancher, who has a place two and one-half miles east of Jefferson and seven miles west thereof, which place is twenty-four miles northeast of Fairplay, believes that common carrier service is needed in his section. He stated that Gately's service for movement of livestock was satisfactory, but he does not know of any service offered by Gately or any other for-hire carrier directly to the ranch. He has been a customer of Shattinger for transportation of livestock out and feed in. Like other witnesses testifying, the rest of his transportation requirements have been handled by personally-owned trucks.

Mr. Jones, for Gately Motor Company, stated that Gately Motor Company had no objection to the issuance of certificate to applicant, limited to the same service which he is authorized to perform under his Private Carrier Permit, plus the transportation of livestock and hay.

Orville Gately, Vice-President and Acting Manager of Gately
Motor Company in the absence of Glen Gately, who is in the Army, stated
that Gately Motor Company (PUC No. 1179) has seventeen units, and is authorized to transport:

ore and concentrates, mining and milling supplies and equipment, coal, sand and gravel, farm produce (including livestock) farm supplies, used household goods and furnishings, office furniture and fixtures, into, out of, and between points within a radius of 20 miles of Alma, except it shall not transport said commodities, or any of them, from, to, or between Denver and Kokomo or points intermediate thereto, on U.S. Highway No. 285, Denver to Fairplay, and State Highway No. 9, Fairplay to Dillon, and State Highway No. 91, Dillon to Kokomo, nor freight of any description between Leadville and other points except between Leadville and points within a radius of 20 miles of Alma; livestock for hire between points within the area bounded by Wilkerson, Kenosha, Trout Creek and Ute Passes, and from and to points in said area, to and from points in the State of Colorado;

that, in addition, South Park Motor Lines, Inc. (PUC No. 1026) is operated by the Gatelys, with authority to transport:

freight and express between Denver and Kokomo, Colorado and all intermediate points, including Bailey, Shaffers' Crossing, Grant, Jefferson, Como, Fairplay, Alma, Breckenridge, Dillon and Frisco, over U. S. Highway No. 285, Denver to Fairplay, State Highway No. 9, Fairplay to Dillon, and Colo. 91, Dillon to Kokomo; general commodities between Denver and Hartsel, Colorado, and one intermediate point, namely, Garo, Colorado by way of U. S. Highway No. 285 and Colorado Highway No. 9;

that his company had not found the handling of stock or hay to be profitable, and for that reason, has no objection to the granting of authority to handle said commodities; that his company had advertised that they were unable to handle livestock during the Fall of 1942, said notice being due to the fact that they had been able to keep trucks busy every day handling other freight which has been more profitable than to use said trucks only three days a week in the handling of livestock, the demand for said service being limited; that also his company has no objection to the handling of any commodities mentioned by applicant within or from or to territory beyond a twenty-mile radius of Alma; that line haul service of South Park Motor Line between Denver. Alma and Fairplay is limited to three days a week; that feed, and other farm supplies, can be back-hauled on said line; that six to eight trucks a week are returned empty out of Denver; that business is needed, in order to comply with O.D.T. regulations; that no request for service has been received from ranchers residing south of Fairplay; that Gately Motor Company, apartnership, performs call and demand service; that said service has been advertised; that he knows of no one residing without the area served by applicant under his "B" permit who has complained about service in or to or from said outside territory.

Fred J. Gately, Manager of South Park Motor Lines, Inc., testified that company has four motor units in use, and furnishes tri-weekly service, only, as stated by Orville Gately; that they need all the business they can get in order to keep going; that it may be a slight inconvenience for people to pick up their freight at Fairplay, or to have it delivered by other Gately operations on a call and demand basis from Fairplay to ranches, but they should be satisfied with said service during the war; that the line haul service hauls freight from Fairplay to Garo and Hartsel.

It appears from the testimony that Gatelys, who operate a call and demand and line haul common carrier service, and a contract service under a Private Carrier Permit, are not interested in conducting a farm service, as such. It appears that they have been devoting their equipment to a line haul service between Denver, Alma, and Fairplay and intermediate points, and to handling commodities other than farm products; that they would like to handle farm supplies and machinery from Denver on their line haul service, in order to build up their tonnage on the line, and would be willing, if asked so to do, to handle supplies to farms other than those adjoining the highway from Alma or Fairplay with their call and demand service, said commodities, for the most part, in the past having been hauled from Alma or Fairplay, if handled over the line haul route, by farmers in their own trucks. The farmers contended that it is difficult for them to maintain their operating equipment under war conditions, and that they want a direct supply-point-to-farm service for farm machinery, feeds, and other farm supplies; that, moreover, the service, if any, of Gatelys from Alma and Fairplay to farms has not been very well publicized, and that they did not know such service was available; that, if Schattinger is to haul livestock and hay for them, he should be permitted to back-haul the other commodities. This, under O.D.T. regulations, would seem to be desirable, since Schattinger, on account of Gatelys' unwillingness to handle livestock and hay, is to handle such commodities in the territory for ranchers. He should be in a position to back-haul feeds and other supplies to the same ranches, so that he has a two-way haul - at least that should be permitted in the terfitory where the testimony disclosed a need

for the service. If Gatelys were adequately serving the ranches, or attempting so to do, we would take a different view. It, however, appeared that there are very few ranches west or southwest of Fairplay, and Gatelys should be able to serve that area better than applicant who resides at Jefferson.

After careful consideration of the record, the Commission is of the opinion, and finds, that public convenience and necessity require, and will require, the operation of applicant as a common carrier by motor vehicle for hire, on call and demand, as hereinafter set forth, and that certificate of public convenience and necessity should issue therefor; further, that Private Carrier Permit No. B-1733 should be cancelled.

## ORDER

## IT IS ORDERED:

That public convenience and necessity require, and will require, the operation of W. E. Schattinger as a common carrier by motor vehicle for hire, on call and demand, for the transportation of: (1) hay, straw, and livestock between Denver, Golden, Divide, and Colorado Springs on the one hand, and, on the other, ranches in that part of Park County, Colorado, located west of a north and south line fifteen miles east of the Town of Jefferson and east of a north and south line through Fairplay; (2) repair parts for farm machinery, livestock feeds, salt, coal, and farm supplies, generally, from Denver, Divide, and Colorado Springs, to ranches in said area, in said Park County, and this order shall be taken, deemed, and held to be a certificate of public convenience and necessity therefor, provided that said applicant, on or before the effective date of this order, in writing, shall elect to accept this certificate upon the conditions heretofore expressed, and shall surrender and authorize the cancellation of his Private Carrier Permit No. B-1733.

The applicant shall file tariffs or rates, rules and regulations as required by the rules and regulations of this Commission within twenty days from date.

The applicant shall operate his carrier system in accordance with the order of the Commission except when prevented by Act of God, the public enemy or extreme conditions. This order is subject to compliance by applicant with all present and future laws and rules and regulations of the Commission.

That the authority herein granted is subject to all applicable orders of The Office of Defense Transportation of the Federal Government.

This order shall become effective twenty days from date.

## By the Commission:

By this application, applicant seeks a certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate a water storage and distribution system to supply certain residents of Weston, Colorado, residing on Water Street and Main Street in Blocks Nos. 1, 2, and 8 of the North Side Addition of Weston, as shown by map appearing in the files herein as Exhibit No. 1.

At the hearing, in Trinidad, Colorado, on February 23, 1943, it appeared that applicant, for many years, was employed by the Trinidad Water Works, and has had considerable experience in the distribution of water; that he is a resident of Weston, and has constructed a storage tank of rock and cement, with a concrete roof, located on Lot 5, Block 2, North Side Addition, Town of Weston, which is capable of storing 18,000 gallons of water; that water is obtained for storage in said tank from a well, distant about 100 yards from said tank, the well being located near the stream bed of the Las Animas River; that said water is now pumped from the well to the storage tank by means of a

# By the Commission:

Applicant herein seeks authority to operate as a Class "B" private carrier by motorwhicle for hire for the transportation of cement mixers, picks, shovels, tools, used lumber, concrete forms, and similar contractors' equipment, from point to point, on construction jobs of Dutton-Kendall & Hunt, and used and new lumber, cement, and other contractors' supplies from Denver, Colorado Springs, and other supply points and railheads, to construction jobs of said firm.

On December 3, 1936, Decision 9052, Robert G. Asher, of De Beque, Colorado, was granted a certificate of public convenience and necessity authorizing,-

"the conduct of a general cartage and transfer business in the town of DeBeque and for the transportation of farm products, including live stock, and farm supplies from and to farms within a 20-mile radius of DeBeque and farms on Roan Creek within thirty miles of DeBeque, to and from the town of DeBeque and other loading points within said area, and to and from points in the above described DeBeque area from and to points outside thereof, all for customers residing within said area; provided, however, that no authority is granted authorizing the transportation of freight from town to town along U. S. Highway No. 24."

The instant application seeks authority to transfer said certificate to Veryl D. and Roy Gibson, of Collbran, Colorado.

The evidence disclosed that the consideration for said transfer including a  $1\frac{1}{2}$ -ton 1938 Ford truck, is the sum of \$1,200.00.

Transferees have been operating said certificate under temporary authority issued by the Commission on July 14, 1942.

It was further disclosed that transferees are now the owners of

Certificate No. 212, which authorizes the transportation of freight and express between Grand Junction and Collbran, via Plateau City, including service to and from Mesa, Colorado, as well as the transportation of passengers and baggage between Grand Junction and Collbran.

The financial standing and operating reliability of transferees were established to the satisfaction of the Commission.

The only protest interposed was on behalf of Howard C. Gilbert, and his protest was not against the granting of the transfer, but in connection with the operating rights under said Certificate No. 1061, which could not be raised at this transfer proceeding.

#### STATEMENT

#### By the Commission:

On January 22, 1943, The Midland Terminal Railway Company filed with the Commission a notice to the effect that it was its intention to discontinue passenger trains Nos. 1 and 2 between Colorado Springs and Cripple Creek and substitute in lieu thereof a combination train furnishing the same service to all communities along the line. The scheduled time of operation would be approximately two hours longer.

It appears that present operations under Trains 1 and 2 are as follows:

Train No. 1 leaves Colorado Springs at 8:30 A. M., and arrives at Cripple Greek at 11:30 A. M.

Train No. 2 leaves Cripple Creek at 2:40 P. M. and arrives at Colorado Springs at 5:35 P. M.

The schedule of the proposed combination train would be as

#### follows:

Leave Colorado Springs at 6:45 A. M., arriving at Cripple Creek at 12:35 P. M.

Leave Cripple Creek at 11:15 A. M., arriving at Colorado Springs at 5:35 P. M.

On February 18, 1943, a petition signed by some 126 residents of Cripple Creek, protesting against the proposed change, was received by the Commission, as well as a letter from the Superintendent of Schools in School

District No. 1. Whereupon, the Commission, on February 19, 1943, Decision 20512, issued its order suspending the effective date for the proposed change in train service, and setting the matter for hearing at Cripple Creek, Colorado, on March 5, 1943.

Since the entry of said I. & S. order, a number of letters have been received by the Commission from signers of said petition, requesting that their protest be withdrawn.

An examination of the grounds for said protest discloses that it is based solely upon the question of the mail service that will be in effect between Colorado Springs and Cripple Creek if new schedules are permitted.

The Commission has been advised by applicant that it proposes to try and work out a more satisfactory mail schedule for the residents of Cripple Creek. We have further been advised by the Railway Mail Service that they have approved the schedule proposed by applicant, but are willing to attempt some plan that will furnish a more satisfactory service if same can be worked out with applicant.

The question of mail service is primarily one to be disposed of by the postal department of the U. S. Government and the carrier involved, and while the Commission might consider the question as one of the factors in connection with the question of what the public convenience and necessity requires, yet it is doubtful if we would base any decision solely upon that ground.

In view of all the facts now before the Commission in the instant matter, and after careful consideration of the record, the Commission has determined that our I. & S. order of February 19, 1943, should be set aside, and applicant should be permitted to substitute the combination train proposed for its present service; provided, however, that all reasonable efforts should be made to furnish Cripple Creek residents with as

expeditious mail service as conditions may warrant.

#### CRDER

#### IT IS ORDERED:

That our Decision No. 20512, dated February 19, 1943, be, and the same is hereby, set aside, and The Midland Terminal Railway Company may, on March 15, 1943, substitute in lieu of its presently operated passenger trains Nos. 1 and 2, combination freight and passenger trains, to be operated upon the schedule submitted to the Commission on January 22, 1943, save and except that said schedule may be changed in such manner as to render a more expeditious mail service between Cripple Creek and Colorado Springs if same can be agreed upon between the applicant and the Railway Mail Service.

On November 7, 1941, the Board of County Commissioners of Sedgwick County, Colorado, filed an application with the Commission for the opening and establishment of a public highway crossing, at grade, over the right-of-way and tracks of the Union Pacific Railroad Company at a point on the Section Line between Sections 10 (ten) and 11 (eleven), Township 11 (eleven) North, Range 46 (Forty-six) West of the 6th P. M. in Sedgwick County, Colorado, said point being approximately 360 feet west of Mile Post 11 of said railroad.

A copy of the application was served on the General Attorney of said railroad company, and on December 9, 1941, a reply thereto was received from the General Attorney, advising the Commission that the crossing, if granted, would be principally for the benefit of only one party, and therefore, the Company would take the position that the opening of a public crossing at this place was not a public convenience and necessity, and would, therefore, create an unnecessary hazard and would be contrary to the best interests of the public from a safety standpoint. It was also stated that the Company would be willing to open a private crossing at said point provided that the person to be

served by the crossing would bear all the expense and execute a regular private crossing agreement with the Company.

A copy of the aforesaid answer to the application was sent to the said County Commissioners on December 3, 1941, to advise whether or not there was a public highway at the point where crossing was desired, and if so, to state the attitude of the Commissioners toward the matter of expense if installation of crossing were granted. No reply was received to the Commission's letter, and a second letter was sent to them on February 10, 1942. No reply was received to this letter, and several other requests were made for a reply to the letter first sent to the Commissioners, but evidently the Commissioners were unable to work out a satisfactory solution to the matter, and further postponements were requested.

The Commission is now advised by the County Clerk, under date of March 3, 1943, that the County Commissioners have decided to take no further action in the matter, and request the matter be closed.

Therefore, in accordance with this request, the Commission will now issue its order dismissing the application.

#### ORDER

#### IT IS ORDERED:

That in compliance with the request of the County Commissioners of Sedgwick County, Colorado, by its Clerk, that no further action be taken in the matter of Application No. 5795, that same be, and is hereby, dismissed.

This order shall become effective twenty (20) days from date.

The above matter was heard at Denver, Colorado, on September 28, 1942.

Clay Snyder, under PUC No. 378, is authorized to transport:

freight from point to point within a radius of 25 miles of Kiowa, Colorado, hogs and calves on call and demand only, from the territory located within a radius of 25 miles of Kiowa to Denver; farm produce (no livestock except hogs and calves), dairy products and farm supplies between Denver and farms located in the territory around Kiowa described as follows: Extending 25 miles east, 6 miles south, 1 mile west, and 25 miles north thereof; farm products (no livestock) between points in the abovedescribed Kiowa area and Bennett and Castle Rock, Colorado, with a back-haul of freight from Castle Rock; dairy products, only, from the area described as follows: beginning at the southwest corner of applicant's present territory, being the southwest corner of Section 17, Township 9-South, Range 63-West; thence west 7 miles to the southwest corner of Section 18, Township 9-South, Range 64-West; thence north 15 miles to the northwest corner of Section 6, Township 7-South, Range 64-West; thence east 7 miles to the northeast corner of Section 6, Township 7-South, Range 63-West; thence south 15 miles to the point of beginning; farm supplies from Denver to his milk producing customers residing in the above-described territory; provided, how-ever, that in the back-haul of farm supplies the same shall be limited to a weight not exceeding 500 pounds to a customer at any one

time; and provided, further, that applicant shall not render service in competition with the authority granted under Certificate No. 455 to serve points west of Running Creek and immediately west of Elizabeth.

Said certificate-holder now seeks authority to transfer said authority to Clayton Beneke and Ralph Litherland, Elizabeth, Colorado.

The transfer includes one 1940 AC 400 GMC Truck, and one 1937 Chevrolet  $1\frac{1}{2}$ -ton truck, both equipped with milk vats. Transferees have two additional Chevrolet trucks.
