NOTICE OF REVISION IN THE PURCHASED  
CAPACITY COST ADJUSTMENT OF  
PUBLIC SERVICE COMPANY OF COLORADO**

You are notified that Public Service Company of Colorado has filed with the Public Utilities Commission of the State of Colorado an Advice Letter to revise its Purchased Capacity Cost Adjustment ("PCCA") Rider, to become effective January 1, 2008, if approved by the Colorado Public Utilities Commission.

The purpose of this filing is to revise the Purchased Capacity Cost Adjustment Rider to recover all prudently incurred purchase capacity costs paid by the Company under all power purchase agreements that are not recovered through the Electric Commodity Adjustment. The proposed revision to the PCCA is based on projected 2008 purchase capacity costs and the PCCA deferred balance as of September 30, 2007. The proposed PCCA rates are as follows:

Residential	\$0.01459/kWh
Residential Demand	\$3.83/kW
Commercial	\$0.01528/kWh
Secondary General Low-Load Factor	\$0.05759/kWh
Secondary General	\$4.61/kW
Primary General	\$4.53/kW
Transmission General	\$4.42/kW

The effect on the Company's annual revenue will be an increase of approximately \$13 million. The proposed changes in the PCCA rates are an increase for all customer classes. The average monthly impact for customers by rate class is projected to be as follows:

In accordance with Rule 1206 of the Rules of Practice and Procedure of the Public Utilities Commission, copies of the proposed and present PCCA Rates summarized above have been filed with the Commission and are available for examination and explanation at the main office of Public Service Company of Colorado, 1225 17th Street, Suite 1000, Denver, Colorado 80202-5533, or at the office of the Public Utilities Commission, 1560 Broadway, Suite 250, Denver, Colorado, 80202.

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Anyone who desires either may file written objection or may seek to intervene as a party in this filing. If you only wish to object to the proposed action, you may file a written objection with the Commission. The filing of a written objection by itself will not allow you to participate as a party in any proceeding on the proposed action. If you wish to participate as a party in this matter, you must file written intervention documents under applicable rules.

Public Service Company has requested that the proposed PCCA rates go into effect without hearing, because the Company states these rates are filed in compliance with existing Commission orders. If the Commission holds a hearing on this application, members of the public may attend any hearing and may make a statement under oath about the proposed revisions, whether or not he/she has filed a written objection or request to intervene.
