I. BY THE COMMISSION

A. Statement

1. This matter comes before the Commission for consideration of a request filed on June 4, 2014 by Freedom Cabs Inc. (Freedom Cabs), to shorten the Commission notice period to ten days (Shortened Notice Request). The Shortened Notice Request was submitted concurrently with Freedom Cabs's Second Petition for a Waiver/Variance (Petition) from Commission Rules 723-6-6255(a)(III)-(VII) of the Rules Regulating Transportation by Motor Vehicle, 4 *Code of Colorado Regulations* (CCR).

B. Findings and Conclusions

2. Through the Shortened Notice Request, Freedom Cabs seeks to shorten notice from 30 days to 10 days from the date the Commission issues the notice ~~of~~ the Petition.

3. In support of its Shortened Notice Request, Freedom Cabs states that it has reason to believe that no other taxi carrier will object or intervene against this Petition, and that Freedom Cabs has been informed that the other taxi carriers have encountered technical delays in complying with Rules 6255(a)(III)-(VII).

4. Rule 1401(a) of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure, 4 CCR 723-1 states "Except as provided by paragraph (d) of this rule, any person may file a notice of intervention as of right or a motion to intervene by permission within 30 days of notice of any administrative or adjudicatory proceeding, unless the Commission's notice or a specific rule or statute provides otherwise."

5. Rule 1003(a) provides that:

The Commission has promulgated these rules to ensure orderly and fair treatment of all persons. The Commission may, for good cause shown, grant waivers or variances from tariffs, Commission rules, and substantive requirements contained in Commission decisions. In making its determination the Commission may take into account, but is not limited to, considerations of hardship, equity, or more effective implementation of overall policy on an individual basis.

6. We find that good cause exists to grant Freedom Cabs's shortened notice request. The reason for the shortened notice request, and the requested time period are reasonable. The Petition will be placed on the next transportation notice, on June 16, 2014, for a period of ten days. Interventions shall be due at **5:00 p.m. on June 26, 2014.**

II. ORDER

A. It Is Ordered That:

1. The request by Freedom Cabs to shorten Commission notice is granted. The notice period for the Petition for Waiver/Variance from Commission Rules 723-6-6255(a)(III)-(VII), 4 *Code of Colorado Regulations* 723-6, shall extend through and including **5:00 p.m. on June 26, 2014.**

2. Any person desiring to intervene or participate as a party in this proceeding, including Staff of the Commission, shall file a petition for leave to intervene, or under the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure, file other appropriate pleadings to become a party, by **5:00 p.m. on June 26, 2014.**

3. This Decision is effective upon its Mailed Date.
