**DECISION GRANTING APPLICATION

AND WAIVING RESPONSE TIME**

I. BY THE COMMISSION

A. Statement

1. This matter comes before the Commission for consideration of an Application for Approval of an Alternative Form of Notice (Application) filed on October 1, 2014 by Black Hills/Colorado Electric Utility Company, LP (Black Hills or Company).

2. Black Hills requests the Commission enter a decision approving an alternative form of notice pursuant to § 40-3-104(1)(c)(I)(D), C.R.S., that will apply to its Advice Letter No. 687. The purpose of Advice Letter No. 687 is to reduce the Black Hills' Demand Side Management Cost Adjustment rider affecting applicable retail customers to become effective January 1, 2015. Black Hills also seeks a waiver of response time to this Application.

3. Black Hills is seeking Commission approval to use the following form of alternative notice:

- a. Filing with the Commission, and keeping open for inspection, Advice Letter No. 687;

- b. Posting on the website for Black Hills Energy: (1) a Customer Notice attached to the Application; and (2) Advice Letter No. 687 and its accompanying tariff sheets, for sixty (60) days;
- c. Printing a message on each customer's bill providing the website URL for the Customer Notice and Advice Letter No. 687 and its accompanying tariff sheets, and a toll-free phone number for assistance, for one full billing cycle beginning with the first bill cycle after filing Advice Letter No. 687; and,
- d. Publishing a legal notice of Advice Letter No. 687 (*i.e.*, Exhibit 1), with size dimensions of 4 columns width and 11 inches height, in three newspapers of general circulation for the service territory: 1) *The Pueblo Chieftain* (two consecutive Sundays, October 5 and October 12, 2014); and; 2) the *Cañon City Daily Record* (two consecutive Fridays, October 10 and October 17, 2014); and, 3) the *Rocky Ford Daily Gazette* (two consecutive Thursdays, October 9 and October 16, 2014).

4. Black Hills argues that there is good cause for the alternative form of notice.

A bill message, unlike a bill insert, provides more visibility to the customer because it is presented on the first page of the bill, where the customer looks for the dollar amount due and the payment deadline. The website posting will provide the required information regarding the amended tariffs to the general public. The toll-free phone number provided in the bill message will give customers a second option to learn more about the amended tariffs if they cannot access the internet for the Company's website. The newspaper publications will provide accessible and timely notice across the Company's entire service territory. According to Black Hills, these alternative forms of notice are expeditious and economic for the Company's customers.

5. The Application contains the information required by the applicable Commission rules and is therefore deemed complete.

6. We find good cause to grant the Application and to waive response time to it. We find that the alternative form of notice proposed by Black Hills is reasonable. The Commission will discuss the merits of Advice Letter No. 687 at a future date.

II. ORDER

A. The Commission Orders That:

1. The Application for Approval of an Alternative Form of Notice (Application) filed on October 1, 2014 by Black Hills/Colorado Electric Utility Company, LP is deemed complete and granted. Response time to the Application is waived.

2. This Decision is effective upon its Mailed Date.
