GRANTING EXTENSION OF TIME**

I. BY THE COMMISSION

A. Statement, Findings, and Conclusions

1. This matter comes before the Commission for consideration of a Request for Extension of Compliance Time filed by the City of Cripple Creek (Applicant) on October 27, 2014.
2. On June 30, 2014, Applicant filed an application for permanent authority to conduct operations as a common carrier by motor vehicle for hire.
3. The Commission noticed this application to all interested persons, firms, and corporations pursuant to § 40-6-108(2), C.R.S., on July 14, 2014.
4. Commission Decision No. C14-1053 (Decision) issued August 29, 2014, granted the Application, and gave Applicant until October 28, 2014, 60 days from the effective date of the Decision, to complete the compliance filing requirements of Ordering Paragraph No. 4 of the Decision.

5. Ordering Paragraph No. 5 of the Decision states “For good cause shown, the Commission may grant additional time for compliance if the request for additional time is filed within 60 days of the effective date of this Decision.”

6. On October 27, 2014, Applicant filed a Request for Extension of Compliance Time, requesting 60 additional days and stating that Applicant was having difficulty providing the necessary proof of insurance and needed additional time to do so.

7. The Commission concludes that Applicant has shown good cause to extend the time for compliance with the Decision for an additional 60 days from the original deadline of October 28, 2014.

II. ORDER

A. The Commission Orders That:

1. The request of the City of Cripple Creek filed on October 27, 2014 that the Commission grant an additional 60 days for it to complete the requirements set forth in Decision No. C14-1053 is granted.

2. The City of Cripple Creek is granted an additional 60 days, through Monday, December 29, 2014 (as the 60th day would otherwise fall on a Saturday), to file Compliance Items in accordance with Ordering Paragraph No. 4 of Commission Decision No. C14-1053.

3. The 20-day time period provided by § 40-6-114(1), C.R.S., to file an application for rehearing, reargument, or reconsideration shall begin on the first day after the Commission mails orders this Decision.

4. This Decision is effective on its Mailed Date.
