
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ATTACHMENT A REQUIREMENTS AND INFORMATION ON USING GOTOMEETING TO ATTEND PREHEARING CONFERENCE


- 1. This Attachment directs the parties on certain aspects of their participation in the remote prehearing conference in this matter using GoToMeeting (https://www.gotomeeting.com/), and provides information which will aid parties in doing so. This is not intended to provide full and complete instructions on how to use GoToMeeting to participate in a prehearing conference. Parties are responsible for ensuring they have familiarized themselves with GoToMeeting and are able to use it for the prehearing conference (see https://support.goto.com/meeting/system-check).
- 2. Participants in a GoToMeeting prehearing conference by video-conference must use a computer, smart phone, or tablet with internet access, an operational microphone, camera, and a speaker. A few minutes prior to the start of the prehearing conference, parties and counsel must enter the link provided to them for the GoToMeeting prehearing conference in their internet browser. Each party is responsible for ensuring that their respective witnesses are provided the same link.
- 3. Participants will then be taken to the screen where they may join the prehearing conference. Parties should select the computer option, as shown in the below image.

¹ These instructions are not directed at using a tablet or smartphone to participate in a GoToMeeting video-conference. Using a smartphone or tablet may limit a participant's ability to view hearing exhibits during the prehearing conference due to screen size. As such, participation by computer is encouraged. Participants who chose to use a smartphone or tablet are responsible for ensuring they are able to fully participate in the prehearing conference.



4. Participants will then be required to confirm their audio settings; once complete, participants should select the "Save and continue" icon. If participants are prompted to allow the session to access their computers' microphone and camera, they should allow access. As explained later, participants will be able to modify their settings during the session should they need to mute their microphone or turn off their cameras.


5. Participants will be prompted to enter their name for identification during the session, as shown in the image below.




- 6. All participants must enter their full name. Among other reasons, this is required for identification and because the presiding official may close the meeting to unauthorized or new participants once all parties have joined.² If the meeting is closed, the ALJ may unlock the prehearing conference upon request to allow the participation of additional individuals.
- 7. Parties and witnesses may control the audio volume using their computer's audio controls. Those who do not want their picture displayed for others in the meeting may select the camera icon in the green circle at the bottom of the video screen at any point. A slash will appear over the camera icon, indicating that the camera has been turned off. Likewise, to mute or turn

off the microphone, select the microphone icon and visually confirm that there is a slash over the microphone icon. Illustratively, the below image shows the microphone turned off and the camera turned on.



8. Conversely, the below image shows the microphone and camera icons turned on and ready to transmit video and audio upon joining the prehearing conference.



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9. A full and complete record and all testimony will be stenographically or

electronically recorded. To facilitate this, participants must minimize feedback and background

noise. First, all participants are required to mute their microphones during the prehearing

conference until called upon by the ALJ. Second, all participants must ensure that they are in a

location with minimal or no background noise while participating in the prehearing conference.

Participants must avoid connecting to the prehearing conference with multiple computers or

devices located in the same room, as this will cause echos and audio feedback. Although not

mandatory, participants are encouraged to participate using headphones connected to their


computers, which may help reduce audio feedback.

10. To terminate participation in the prehearing conference, select the telephone

handset icon with the word "Leave" underneath it and then select "Yes" in the pop-up box, as

shown below. A party who inadvertently selects the handset icon may select "Not now" instead

of "Yes" to stay in the meeting, as shown below.
