STATEMENT, FINDINGS, AND CONCLUSIONS

BY THE COMMISSION:

1. On December 3, 1991, Greg Demers, doing business as Ace Towing, filed Docket No. 91A-799BY-TA for temporary authority to conduct operations as a contract carrier by motor vehicle for hire for the transportation of building materials between all points in the County of Mesa, State of Colorado. This application is restricted to providing service for only 84 Lumber.

2. The Commission gave notice of the application on December 23, 1991. No interventions were filed.

3. By § 40-6-120, C.R.S., the application for temporary authority is under consideration for a Commission order.

4. Section 40-6-120(1), C.R.S., authorizes the Commission to grant temporary authority when there appears to be ". . . an immediate and urgent need to any point or within a territory having no carrier service capable of meeting such need."

5. The support filed on behalf of this application indicates that Applicant is the only source of delivery for 84 Lumber's building supplies.

6. The Commission finds due to the facts stated in paragraph (5) above, that there is an immediate and urgent need and there-fore, the Commission will grant the application.

7. The Applicant has adequate equipment and financial resources to begin immediate service within the scope of the authority sought and is willing, ready and able to operate under all Commission rules and regulations governing carriers by motor vehicle.

8. This application for temporary authority is in the public interest and should be granted.

9. The Applicant is advised that the granting of a temporary authority makes no presumption that a permanent authority will be granted.

THEREFORE THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

1. Greg Demers, doing business as Ace Towing, is granted temporary authority to conduct operations as a contract carrier for a period of 165 days commencing from the mailed date, with authority as set forth in the attached appendix, which is conditioned on Applicant meeting the requirements contained in this Order, and is not effective until those requirements have been met.

2. Greg Demers, doing business as Ace Towing, shall not commence operations until all requirements have been met, including the proper filing of insurance, tariffs and payment of required fees. Operations may not begin until these requirements have been met, and the Applicant has been notified by the Commission that operations may begin.

3. Unless Greg Demers, doing business as Ace Towing, meets all the requirements indicated within 30 days of the mailed date of this order, the authority granted will be void.

4. The 20-day time period provided by § 40-6-114(1), C.R.S., to file an application for rehearing, reargument, or reconsid- eration shall begin on the first day after the Commission mails or serves this decision.
