## COMMISSION ORDER GRANTING TEMPORARY AUTHORITY

#### STATEMENT, FINDINGS, AND CONCLUSIONS

#### BY THE COMMISSION:

- 1. On April 21, 1992, Timothy D. and Susan P. Stevens, doing business as Errands, Etc..., filed Docket No. 92A-164BY-TA for temporary authority to conduct operations as a contract carrier by motor vehicle for hire for the transportation of library books between all points in the County of Boulder, State of Colorado. This application is restricted to providing service for only the Boulder Public Library.
- 2. The Commission gave notice of the application on April 27, 1992. No interventions opposing a grant of the application were filed.
- 3. By \$ 40-6-120, C.R.S., the application for temporary authority is under consideration for a Commission order.

- 4. Section 40-6-120 (1), C.R.S., authorizes the Commission to grant temporary authority when there appears to be "... an immediate and urgent need to any point or within a territory having no carrier service capable of meeting such need."
- 5. The support filed on behalf of this application indicates a need for the service by the Boulder Public Library System. The Applicant is the only carrier bidding on the job that the Library can afford.
- 6. The Commission finds due to the facts stated in paragraph 5 above, there is as immediate and urgent need for additional transportation services. The Commission will grant the application.
- 7. The Applicant has adequate equipment and financial resources to begin immediate service within the scope of the authority sought and is willing, ready, and able to operate under all Commission rules and regulations governing carriers by motor vehicle.
- 8. This application for temporary authority is in the public interest and should be granted.
- 9. The Applicant is advised that the granting of an temporary authority makes no presumption that permanent authority will be granted.

#### THEREFORE THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

- 1. Timothy D. and Susan P. Stevens, doing business as Errands, Etc..., is granted temporary authority to conduct operations as a contract carrier by motor vehicle for hire for a period of 165 days commencing from the mailed date of this order, with authority as set forth in the attached appendix.
- 2. Timothy D. and Susan P. Stevens, doing business as Errands, Etc..., shall not commence operation until all requirements have been met and notice in writing has been received from the Commission that the Applicant is in compliance and may begin service.
- 3. The 20-day time period provided by \$ 40-6-114(1), C.R.S., to file an application for rehearing, reargument, or reconsid-eration shall begin on the first day after the Commission mails or serves this decision.
