# COMMISSION ORDER GRANTING TEMPORARY AUTHORITY IN PART

Mailed date: July 24, 1995 Adopted date: July 19, 1995

### I.BY THE COMMISSION:

### A.Statement, Findings, and Conclusion

1.On June 16, 1995, Quirk Enterprises, L.L.C., doing business as

Central Hawk Tours, filed an application (Docket No.

95A-273CP-TA) for temporary authority to conduct
operations as a common carrier by motor vehicle for
hire for the transportation of passengers and their
baggage, in call-and-demand limousine service,
between all points within the Counties of Denver,
Boulder, Adams, Arapahoe, and Jefferson, State of
Colorado, and between said points, on the one hand,
and points in the Counties of Grand, Clear Creek,

Gilpin, Eagle, Summit, El Paso, Weld, and Larimer, State of Colorado, on the other hand. The application is restricted to the use of vehicles which are equipped with wheelchair lifts.

- 2. The Commission gave notice of the application on June 26, 1995. Interventions opposing a grant of the application were filed by Rocky Mountain Shuttlines, Inc., doing Mountain Supercoach; business as Rocky BBB Transportation, Inc., doing business as Overland Airport Express, Inc.; Black Hawk - Central City Ace Express, Inc.; Four Winds, Inc., doing business as Peoples Choice Transporta-tion, Inc.; Queen City Transportation, Inc.; Casino Transportation, Inc.; Aspen Limousine Service, Inc., doing business as Vans to Vail; Boulder Airporter, Inc.; Colorado PUC 191 Corp.; Golden West Commuter, LLC; Yellow Cab Cooperative Association, doing business as Yellow Cab, Inc., and its division, Denver Airport Limousine Service, Inc., doing business as Denver Airport Shuttle.
- 3.By § 40-6-120, C.R.S., the application for temporary authority is under consideration for a Commission order.
- 4. Pursuant to § 40-6-120(1), C.R.S., the Commission is authorized to grant temporary authority when there appears to be "an immediate and urgent need to any point or within

a territory having no carrier service capable of meeting such need."

- 5. The support filed on behalf of this application indicates that individuals who must utilize a wheelchair are severely restricted from access to transit between the Denver metropolitan area and Central City and Black Hawk, Colorado. No support was filed for transportation service to points beyond this limited scope. Therefore, we cannot grant temporary authority for the entire geographic scope of the application.
- 6. The intervenors who provide transportation service between the Denver metropolitan area and Central City and Black Hawk, Colorado state that they provide adequate service to the public, including service to those who must utilize a wheelchair. However, the application support indicates that the existing carriers are not capable of providing equivalent service to both ambulatory and wheelchair-using passengers. For an individual using a wheelchair to transportation between Denver and Central City and/or Black Hawk, Colorado, special arrangements must be made well in advance of any planned departure to the gambling areas. These limitations upon present service to the disabled community lead us to conclude that this application should be granted. At the same

time the record indicates that individuals using wheelchairs typically travel in groups composed of both ambulatory and non-ambulatory persons.

- 7. There is an immediate and urgent need for a specialized transportation service to be provided for groups of ambulatory and wheelchair-using individuals. Within the metropolitan area there exists a need for a fleet of vehicles which is entirely wheelchair accessible. Since the primary justification for this application relates to service for individuals in wheelchairs this application should be further restricted to provide that (1) all marketing efforts of the Applicant be directed to the wheelchair-using public; and (2) the Applicant should be restricted to utilizing only the number of vehicles presently in its fleet. With these additional restrictions, the Commission will grant the application in part, to provide service between the Denver metropolitan area and Central City and Black Hawk, Colorado.
- 8. The Applicant has adequate equipment and financial resources to begin immediate service within the scope of the authority to be granted and is willing, ready, and able to operate under all Commission rules and regulations governing common carriers by motor vehicle.

- 9. This application for temporary authority is in the public interest and should be granted in part.
  - 10. The Applicant is advised that the granting of a temporary authority makes no presumption that permanent authority will be granted. In addition, the Applicant is advised that the burden of proof to establish the need for a new carrier on a permanent basis, rests solely upon the applicant.

# II.ORDER

#### A. The Commission Orders That:

- 1. The hearing set for September 12, 1995 was set in error and is hereby vacated.
- 2.Quirk Enterprises, L.L.C., doing business as Central Hawk Tours, is granted temporary authority to conduct operations as a common carrier by motor vehicle for hire for a period of 150 days commenc-ing from the Mailed Date of this Order, with authority as set forth in the attached Appendix.
- 3.Quirk Enterprises, L.L.C., doing business as Central Hawk Tours, shall not commence operation until all requirements have been met and notice in writing has been received from the Commission that the Applicant is in compliance and may begin service. If the Applicant does not comply with the requirements of this ordering

paragraph within 30 days of the effective date of this Order, then ordering paragraph 1 above, which grants authority to the Applicant, shall be void, and the authority granted shall then be void. On good cause shown, the Commission may grant additional time for compliance, if the request for additional time is filed within the 30 days.

4. The 20-day time period provided by § 40-6-114(1), C.R.S., to file an application for rehearing, reargument, or reconsideration shall begin on the first day after

the Commission mails or serves this Decision. **B.**This Order is effective on its Mailed Date.
