I. <u>BY THE COMMISSION:</u>

A. Statement, Findings and Conclusions

1. On July 15, 2004, Mach 3 Express, Inc., doing business as World Class Limousine, Inc. (World Class), filed an application seeking authority to suspend operations under Contract Carrier Permit No. B-9815.

2. The Commission noticed this application to all interested persons, firms, and corporations pursuant to § 40-6-108(2), C.R.S., on July 26, 2004. The Commission set this matter for hearing on September 24, 2004.

3. No petition to intervene or otherwise participate in this proceeding has been filed. This proceeding is uncontested. Under § 40-6-109(5), C.R.S., this matter may be determined without a hearing.

4. The information submitted with this application warrants granting the requested suspension.

5. The application for authority to suspend Contract Carrier Permit No. B-9815 is in the public interest.

II. ORDER

A. The Commission Orders That:

1. The hearing set for September 24, 2004, is vacated.

2. This application was deemed complete on September 1, 2004, within the meaning of § 40-6-109.5, C.R.S.

3. The application filed by World Class for authority to suspend operations under Contract Carrier Permit No. B-9815 is granted.

 The suspension of motor vehicle operations under Contract Carrier Permit No. B-9815 is authorized from June 18, 2004 through December 18, 2004.

5. On or before November 19, 2004, World Class shall file a written request either to reinstate Contract Carrier Permit No. B-9815 or to extend the suspension period.

6. Prior to reinstatement, World Class shall cause to be filed with the Commission certificates of insurance as required by Commission rules. World Class shall also file a proper tariff and pay the appropriate vehicle identification fee.

7. The failure to file a timely written request either to reinstate Contract Carrier Permit No. B-9815 or to extend the suspension period may result in revocation of the certificate without further notice.

8. The 20-day time-period provided by § 40-6-114(1), C.R.S., to file an application for rehearing, re-argument, or reconsideration shall begin on the first day after the Commission mails or serves this Order.

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9. This Order is effective on its Mailed Date.
