**COMMISSION ORDER APPROVING TRANSFER OF
CONTRACT CARRIER PERMIT**

I. BY THE COMMISSION:

A. Statement, Findings and Conclusions

1. On September 10, 2004, University Services, Inc., doing business as Passenger Express (Passenger Express) filed an application for approval to transfer Contract Carrier Permit No. B-9790 to Global Transportation, LLC, doing business as Global Passenger Service, LLC (Global Transportation).

2. The Commission noticed this application to all interested persons, firms, and corporations pursuant to § 40-6-108(2), C.R.S., on September 20, 2004. The Commission set this matter for hearing on November 19, 2004.

3. No petition to intervene or otherwise participate in this proceeding has been filed. This proceeding is uncontested. Under § 40-6-109(5), C.R.S., this matter may be determined without a hearing.

4. The information submitted with this application warrants granting the requested transfer.

5. The financial standing of Global Transportation has been satisfactorily established.

6. Global Transportation is ready, willing, and able to properly perform the service as requested.

7. This application for permanent approval of the transfer of CPCN PUC No. B-9790 is in the public interest.

II. ORDER

A. The Commission Orders That:

1. The hearing set for November 19, 2004, is vacated.

2. This application was deemed complete on October 27, 2004, within the meaning of § 40-6-109.5, C.R.S.

3. The application filed by Passenger Express for approval to transfer Contract Carrier Permit No. B-9790, subject to encumbrances, if any, against the authority, to Global Transportation is granted.

4. Global Transportation shall operate in accordance with all applicable Commission rules and regulations.

5. Approval of the transfer of Contract Carrier Permit No. B-9790 is conditioned on the prior filing by Passenger Express of delinquent reports, if any, covering operations under the permit up to the consummation of the transfer.

6. Global Transportation shall cause to be filed with the Commission certificates of insurance as required by Commission rules. Global Transportation shall also adopt the tariff of Passenger Express which shall become that of Global Transportation until changed in accordance with the public utilities law. Global Transportation shall pay the appropriate vehicle identification fee and issuance fee. Passenger Express shall file a terminating annual report from the first of January to the date of this Order. An acceptance of transfer signed by both Passenger Express and Global Transportation shall be filed with the Commission. Global Transportation may not begin operations until these requirements have been met and it has received notice in writing from the Commission stating that it is in compliance and may begin service.

7. If Passenger Express and Global Transportation do not comply with the requirements of this Order within 60 days of its effective date, then the approval to transfer Contract Carrier Permit No. B-9790 shall be void. For good cause shown, the Commission may grant additional time for compliance if the request for additional time is filed within the 60 days.

8. The 20-day time-period provided by § 40-6-114(1), C.R.S., to file an application for rehearing, re-argument, or reconsideration shall begin on the first day after the Commission mails or serves this Order.

9. This Order is effective on its Mailed Date.
