**COMMISSION ORDER GRANTING EXTENSION
TO CERTIFICATE OF PUBLIC CONVENIENCE
AND NECESSITY**

I. BY THE COMMISSION:

A. Statement, Findings and Conclusions

1. On September 13, 2004, RDSM Transportation, Ltd., doing business as Yellow Cab Company of Colorado Springs &/or Greater Colorado Springs Transportation Company (Yellow Cab), filed an application for permanent authority to extend operations under Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity PUC No. 109. The extended authority would read as follows:

Transportation of passengers and their baggage, in taxi service: I. between all points within El Paso County, State of Colorado; Teller County, State of Colorado; and all points in Douglas County, State of Colorado, that are located south of a line beginning on the Douglas/Jefferson County boundary, to a point on the Douglas/Elbert boundary, said line is parallel to the northern El Paso County boundary as drawn through Exit 172 of Interstate Highway 25; and from said points, on the one hand, to all points within the

State of Colorado, on the other hand; and II. from all points in the City and County of Denver, to all points within the Counties of El Paso and Teller, State of Colorado.

2. The Commission noticed this application to all interested persons, firms, and corporations pursuant to § 40-6-108(2), C.R.S., on September 20, 2004. The Commission set this matter for hearing on November 23, 2004.

3. No petition to intervene or otherwise participate in this proceeding has been filed. This proceeding is uncontested. Under § 40-6-109(5), C.R.S., this matter may be determined without a hearing.

4. The information submitted with this application warrants granting the requested extension.

5. The present or future public convenience and necessity requires, or will require, the transportation service as requested.

6. Yellow Cab is ready, willing, and able to properly perform the service as requested.

7. This application for permanent authority is in the public interest.

II. ORDER

A. The Commission Orders That:

1. The hearing set for November 23, 2004, is vacated.

2. This application was deemed complete on October 27, 2004, within the meaning of § 40-6-109.5, C.R.S.

3. Yellow Cab is authorized to extend operations under Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity PUC No. 109 as requested in this application.

4. The complete authority under Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity PUC No. 109, as extended, shall be as set forth in the Appendix.

5. Yellow Cab shall file a proper tariff and pay the issuance fee and appropriate vehicle identification fee. Yellow Cab may not begin extended operations until these requirements have been met and it has received notice in writing from the Commission stating that it is in compliance and may begin service.

6. If Yellow Cab does not comply with the requirements of this Order within 60 days of its effective date, then the authority to conduct operations shall be void. For good cause shown, the Commission may grant additional time for compliance if the request for additional time is filed within the 60 days.

7. The 20-day time-period provided by § 40-6-114(1), C.R.S., to file an application for rehearing, re-argument, or reconsideration shall begin on the first day after the Commission mails or serves this Order.

8. This Order is effective on its Mailed Date.
