**COMMISSION ORDER GRANTING TARIFF CHANGES
ON LESS-THAN-STATUTORY NOTICE**

I. BY THE COMMISSION:

A. Statement

1. On October 27, 2004, Boulder Taxi, LLC. doing business as Boulder Yellow Cab filed an application for authority to publish Original Page Number 7d to Passenger Tariff Number 1 to become effective on less-than-statutory notice. Boulder Yellow Cab provides taxi service in the Boulder metropolitan area.

2. Boulder Yellow Cab proposes to publish several revisions to Passenger Tariff Number 1 that will eliminate waiting time including traffic delay and extra passenger charge. The taximeter charge or other mileage calculation through MapPoint will apply whichever is determined to be the most accurate. The changes will result in net reductions.

3. In support of the application, Boulder Yellow Cab states that the revision is intended to facilitate billing for the new Medicaid contractor Logisticare, which has requested reduced rates.

4. Rule 31(f)(1) of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure, 4 *Code of Colorado Regulations* 723-1, allows an order authorizing carriers to change tariffs or time schedules on less-than-statutory notice for good cause shown.

5. The Commission finds that good cause has been shown for the approval of the proposed changes in Original Page Number 7d to Passenger Tariff Number 1 and that the application should be granted.

II. ORDER

A. The Commission Orders That:

1. The application of Boulder Taxi, LLC. doing business as Boulder Yellow Cab authority to publish Original Page Number 7d to Passenger Tariff Number 1 to become effective on less-than-statutory notice is granted.

2. Original Page Number 7d to Passenger Tariff Number 1 shall be published on not less than one day's notice to the Commission and the general public.

3. The 20-day time period provided by § 40-6-114(1), C.R.S., to file an application for rehearing, re-argument, or reconsideration shall begin on the first day after the Commission mails or serves this Order.

4. This Order is effective on its Mailed Date.
