**INTERIM ORDER OF

GRANTING MOTION FOR
EXTENSION OF TIME**

I. STATEMENT

1. On February 25, 2004, the Colorado Public Utilities Commission ordered all telecommunications service providers to file a Colorado High Cost Support Mechanism (CHCSM) Worksheet or Declaration of De Minimus Form for the 2003 reporting period on or before March 31, 2004. *See*, Decision No. C04-0200 and 4 *Code of Colorado Regulations* 723-41-7.2 and 7.2.1.2. Decision No. C04-0200 indicated that telecommunications service providers subject to these requirements could request an extension of time to make the subject filings.

2. On March 18, 2004, AT&T Communications of the Mountain States, Inc., and TCG Colorado (collectively, AT&T) filed a Motion for Extension of Time to File CHCSM Worksheet (Motion). The Motion indicates that the data used to complete AT&T's CHCSM Worksheets is taken from data contained on the Form 499A it files with the Federal Communications Commission (FCC). Since the March 31, 2004, deadline for filing the CHCSM Worksheets precedes the deadline for filing the FCC Form 499A, AT&T requests that it

be granted an extension of time, through and including April 9, 2004, to file its CHCSM Worksheets.

3. Good grounds having been shown, the Motion will be granted.

II. ORDER

A. It Is Ordered That:

1. The Motion for Extension of Time to File CHCSM Worksheet filed in this matter by AT&T Communications of the Mountain States, Inc., and TCG Colorado is granted.

2. AT&T Communications of the Mountain States, Inc., and TCG Colorado shall file their completed Colorado High Cost Support Mechanism Worksheets for the 2003 reporting period on or before April 9, 2004.

3. This Order shall be effective immediately.
