**INTERIM COMMISSION DECISION GRANTING
REQUEST FOR ALTERNATIVE FORM OF NOTICE**

I. BY THE COMMISSION

A. Statement, Findings, and Conclusions

1. On March 31, 2020, Black Hills Colorado Electric, LLC (Black Hills or the Company) filed a Motion for Approval of Alternative Form of Notice (Motion) to apply to Black Hills' Advice Letter No. 786 – Electric to amend its Demand Side Management Cost Adjustment (DSMCA) Calculation inputs and Demand Side Management tariff language, on Tariff Sheet Nos. 69, 69A, and 71, in the Rates section of its Colo. P.U.C. No. 11-Electric Tariff. Black Hills represents that the proposed tariff amendments will increase the DSMCA rate from 1.82 percent to 1.98 percent, beginning July 1, 2020.

2. By its Motion, Black Hills seeks approval to use as alternative notice for its amendments to its Electric Cost Adjustment to include the following:

- a. Filing with the Commission, and keeping open for inspection, Advice letter No. 786-Electric, in addition to posting the advice letter and customer notice on the Company's website, as discussed in the Motion;
- b. Printing a message on each applicable customer's bill for one full billing cycle, in addition to providing the website URL for customer notice and Advice Letter No. 786-Electric and its accompanying tariff sheet, and a

toll-free phone number for assistance, beginning one week after the filing of Advice Letter No. 786-Electric.

- c. Publishing legal notice of Advice Letter No. 786-Electric in three newspapers of general circulation for the service territory: 1) *The Pueblo Chieftain*, two consecutive Tuesdays, April 7 and 14, 2020; 2) the *Canon City Daily Record*, two consecutive Fridays, April 10 and 17, 2020; and 3) the *Rocky Ford Daily Gazette*, two consecutive Thursdays, April 9 and 16, 2020.

3. Black Hills states that the above-listed alternative form of notice is necessary, even though Senate Bill 19-236 changed the alternative form of notices allowable pursuant to § 40-3-104(1)(c)(I), C.R.S. Black Hills represents that the statutory notice either involves unwarranted time and materials expenses, or they conflict with the Company's billing cycles, preventing the Company from delivering bill messages or bill inserts to affected customers during the first 20 days of the 30-day period before the effective date. In addition, Black Hills states that, at this time, a vast number of the Company's customers are not enrolled to receive alerts via email or text. Black Hills further includes that it believes that through noticing the customers via bill messages, legal notice publication, and the required website posting, the Company will be able to reach all customers in the service territory in an affordable and efficient manner.

4. As good cause to grant the Motion, Black Hills states that the bill message does not conflict with the Company's billing cycle, and provides visibility to the customer; the toll-free phone number provided in the bill message will give customers a second option to learn more about the amended tariff if the customer cannot access the website; and newspaper publications will ensure general notice to customers throughout the Company's service territory.

5. Pursuant to § 40-3-104(1)(c)(I)(E), C.R.S., and 4 *Code of Colorado Regulations* 723-1-1207(b) of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure, a utility may request to

provide an alternative form of notice of proposed tariff changes. We find the alternative form of notice proposed by Black Hills in its Motion to apply to Advice Letter No. 786-Electric, is reasonable with respect to the Company’s stakeholders and its general body of electric ratepayers. We therefore find good cause to approve the alternative form of notice requested by Black Hills.

II. ORDER

A. It Is Ordered That:

1. The request for alternative form of notice to apply to Advice Letter No. 786-Electric proposed in the Motion for Alternative Form of Notice filed by Black Hills Electric, LLC on March 31, 2020, is granted.

2. This Decision is effective on its Mailed Date.
