I. <u>BY THE COMMISSION</u>

A. Statement, Findings, and Conclusions

1. On March 1, 2024, Black Hills Colorado Gas, Inc. (Black Hills) filed its initial Gas Infrastructure Plan (GIP). Black Hills made the filing consistent with provisions in the Commission's Rules Regulating Gas Utilities, 4 *Code of Colorado Regulations* (CCR) 723-4-4550 to 4555.

- 2. Through Decision No. C24-0260, the Commission required the parties to confer and file proposed discovery parameters ten days after the Commission established parties to this Proceeding.
- 3. On June 11, 2024, Black Hills filed Consensus Proposed Discovery Parameters. The discovery parameters include limits on the number of interrogatories, dates for the provision of workpapers and executables, and deadlines for serving discovery responses. Additionally, the

parameters require that responses to discovery requests will be served within seven business days of receipt of the request.

- 4. We find that the discovery procedures proposed by the parties are reasonable, and therefore we adopt the discovery parameters set forth in the Consensus Proposed Discovery Parameters.
- 5. Additionally, we refer all discovery disputes and motions for extraordinary protection to the Administrative Law Judge that is scheduling and convening a public comment hearing in this Proceeding.

II. ORDER

A. It Is Ordered That:

- 1. The discovery parameters set forth in the Consensus Proposed Discovery Parameters filed by Black Hills Colorado Gas, Inc., on June 11, 2024, are adopted.
- 2. All discovery disputes are referred to the Administrative Law Judge that is scheduling and convening a public comment hearing in this Proceeding.
- Motions for extraordinary protection filed in this Proceeding are also referred to the
 ALJ.

- 4. This Decision is effective upon its Issued Date.
