INTERIM DECISION GRANTING MOTION TO EXTEND STAFF'S DEADLINE TO FILE ANSWER TESTIMONY AND WAIVE RESPONSE TIME

I. <u>STATEMENT</u>

- 1. On March 1, 2024, Papason LLC, doing business as Baxter Water & Services ("Baxter" or "Applicant") filed with the Commission its Application for Simplified Regulatory Treatment and Participation in the Resource Cost Pass-Through Option. This filing commenced Proceeding No. 24A-0106W.
- 2. On April 19, 2024, the Trial Staff of the Public Utilities Commission ("Staff") timely noticed its intervention of right and requested a hearing in this matter.¹
- 3. On May 1, 2024, the Commission referred this matter to an Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) by minute entry.

4. By Decision No. 24A-0391, issued June 6, 2024, the undersigned ALJ, among other things, adopted procedures for this Proceeding. According to Decision No. 24A-0391, the deadline for the submission of Staff's Answer Testimony is July 19, 2024.

- 5. On July 19, 2024, Staff filed its Unopposed Motion to Extend Staff's Deadline to File Answer Testimony and to Waive Response Time ("Unopposed Motion"). In the Unopposed Motion, Staff states that the parties have engaged in lengthy and complex discussions in this matter and agreed on the outlines of a settlement in principle this week.² Staff requests that the procedural schedule be modified by the granting a one-week extension of time, July 26, 2024, for Staff to file its Answer Testimony.³ Staff states that the requested extension of time would allow the parties sufficient time to possibly finalize their settlement agreement and submit a request to suspend the remained of the procedural schedule, or, in the case that the settlement discussions fall through, provide Staff with sufficient time to prepare and file its Answer Testimony. ⁴ Lastly, Staff States that Applicant supports Staff's extension request.⁵
- 6. The Unopposed Motion is unopposed, and Staff stated good cause for the granting of Staff's extension request. Accordingly, response time to the Motion will be waived and the Motion will be granted, as ordered below.
